CONSIDER RE-LOCATION OF CHURCH PARSONAGE

Business Encroachment May Force Center Congregationalists to Sell Property.

The erection of business blocks on the west side of Main street near the corner of Park street will mean the re-location of the Center Congregational church parsonage before long, Center church parishioners intimate. The parsonage is at Main and Locust streets adjacent to a block now in the process of erection.

The Ecclesiastical society committee is considering various locations for the parsonage should it be decided to move it. William Parkis is chairman of the committee which also includes Stephen Hale and William Gardner.

In commenting on the matter last night, Rev. Watson Woodruff said that although he felt reasonably certain that the parsonage would be eventually located elsewhere, he did not know of any plans calling for an immediate change. He said that there are no offers for the property at present so far as he knows, but that the pressure of business would undoubtedly eventually make the property too valuable for residential purposes. When the adjoining business block site was purchased by Nathan B. Richards, an offer was made for the parsonage property, but it was not accepted.

PROBE GERMANY'S GAS CASE

Berlin, May 24.—Following a Cabinet discussion of the poison gas explosion at Hamburg, when the whole population was menaced, it was officially stated today that neither the German government nor the Reichswehr was involved in the storage of the phosgene gas.

A statement in the German press, which was said to have been officially inspired, demands an international agreement prohibiting the use of poison gas in warfare.

The government promises trial and punishment for any one found guilty of violating the law.

Some of the 250 asphyxiated victims in the hospitals at Hamburg are undergoing acute agony as a result of breathing the fatal fumes.

Automobile thieves had meted out to them last year; in the federal courts, sentences, totaling 2,798 years and fines amounting to \$63,297.

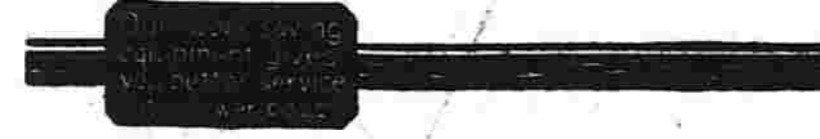

**STAMFORD CO. LOSES
ITS INSURANCE SUIT**

Bridgeport, Conn., May 24.—The Davis-Scotfield Co., of Stamford, cannot recover from seven insurance companies for a loss of \$10,483.65 sustained in a fire that destroyed its warehouse in Glenbrook on January 11, 1927, according to a decision handed down here today by Judge Alfred C. Baldwin, of superior court, following a trial of the suit for \$15,550 damages that was heard here last week.

Judge Baldwin finds for the defendants in a decision covering nine pages in which he declares that "a gross fraud was perpetrated on them by Henry N. Scotfield, Jr., former assistant treasurer and manager of the company, who is now serving a term for embezzlement."

R. G. Davis & Sons, of New Haven, owners of 197 shares of the stock in the Stamford concern, were involved in the suit as plaintiffs. Judge Baldwin's decision declares that this concern "acted with integrity and honor" in its dealings with Davis-Scotfield Co., and is in no way to be blamed for the conditions, leading up to the suit.

Judge Baldwin declares that the insurance companies did not know all of the circumstances concerning Scotfield and that if the companies had known the circumstances the policies would not have been issued. Scotfield himself failed to inform the companies when he made application for the policies, Judge Baldwin declared, and so the policies were rendered void.

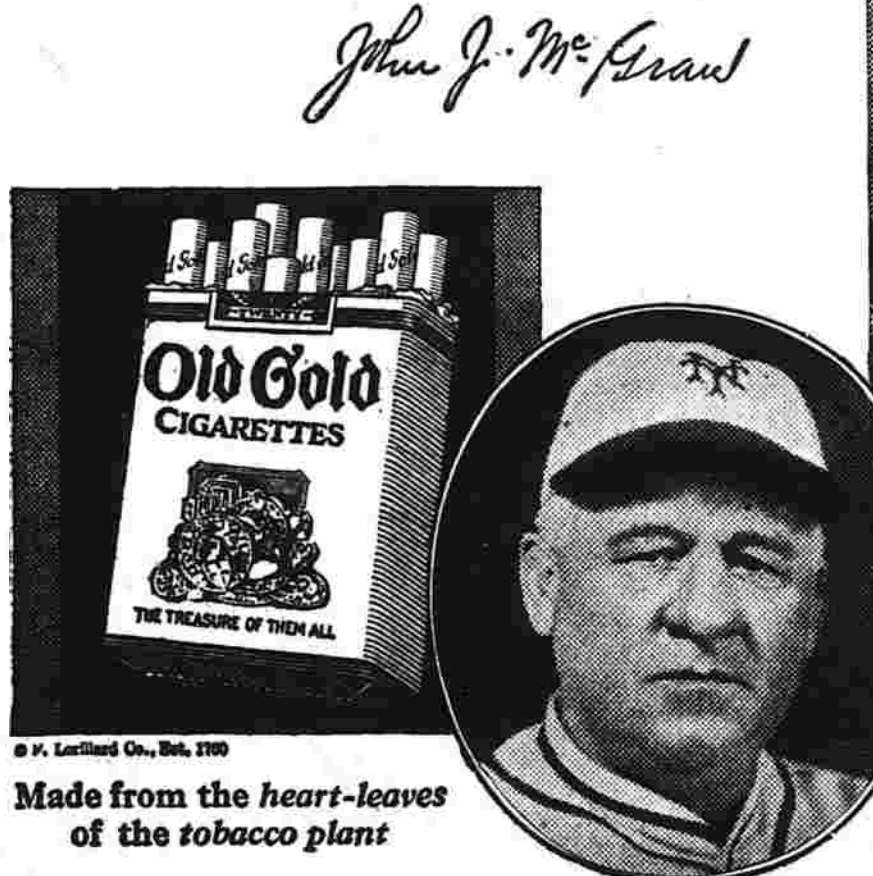
