HOOVER GETS **BIG WELCOME** IN ARGENTINA

Crowds Cheer Him All Along Line of Parade-To Remain Two Days in Buenos Aires.

Buenos Aires, Argentina, Dec. 14 -Impressed by the cordiality of the popular welcome accorded him upon his arrival here, President-Elect Hoover today began the first of two busy days of official banquets, receptions and speeches after a good night's rest at the American Embassy.

There was no perturbation among members of Mr. Hoover's "good-will" party over reports that a plot aimed at the president-elect's life had been frustrated only two days before his arrival. Nevertheless. Mr. Hoover's temporary residence, the American Embassy, is constantly under heavy guard.

The last thirty miles of the Hoover party's journey resembled a campaigning tour of a candidate for presidential election in the United States. Throngs of cheering people gathered at every crossing. A holiday atmosphere pervad-"Vivas" filled the air.


