## for New Telephone Construction in Connecticut during 1930

HE past twelve months witnessed a steady onward march toward a more dependable and satisfactory telephone service to the people of Connecticut. Yet the accomplishments of 1929 are but an indication of greater activities in the future. An evidence of this is the increase in expenditure for new telephone construction planned for this year, to keep in advance of demands and to effect improvements in the service. Furthermore, our faith in Connecticut and in its future progress and prosperity is expressed by our construction program for the next five years, calling for an expenditure of \$68,000,000 - sum substantially greater than the value of the entire physical plant in service at present, after more than fifty years of operation.

## A Comparison of some Results in 1929 and of Plans for 1930

### What occurred in 1929

The expenditure for new buildings and for additions to existing ones during the year amounted to \$1,225,000.

A total of 33,000 telephones in Connecticut were converted to the dial system of operation during the past year.

Central office equipment, such as switch-boards, dial mechanism and other operating equipment, cost \$2,880,000.

The amount expended for private branch exchanges which were installed during the year was about \$400,000.

Lead-sheathed cables for local service use which were placed in service during last year cost approximately \$1,230,000.

The expenditure for conduit—the tile ducts through which underground cables are run-was \$700,000.

About \$700,000 was spent during the year for the purchase and installation of additional cables for toll service.

### What is planned for 1930

The building construction program for this year is estimated at \$1,940,000—an increase of 58% over 1929.

This year about 58,000 manual telephones will be changed to dial service— an increase of 76% over 1929.

Central office equipment to be installed during the year will cost \$3,475,000—an increase of 21% over 1929.

The private branch exchanges which are to be installed will cost about \$975,000—an increase of 144% over 1929.

The estimated expenditure in 1930 for new local service cables is \$1,535,000an increase of 25% over 1929.



Cables for toll service use to be installed during 1930 will cost \$1,015,000—an increase of 45% over, 1929.




