Bitter Battle Rages As Reds in Kuestrin; Push Nearer Stettin

Russian Tanks and Infantry Attack 17 Times But Finally are Driven Back to Suburbs, German Report; Crossing Of Oder Not Yet Officially Confirmed by Reds; Prepare Assault. London, March 3.—(AP)—The troops of Marshal Gergory Zhukov in their offensive toward Berlin have fought into Kuestrin a second time, the Germans reported today and a bitter battle is raging in the ancient streets of the Oder river fortress. Russian tanks and infantry attacked the town from the north and south by the Russians who had driven across the Oder to within 20 miles of Berlin—but were finally driven back to the suburbs, a German broadcast announced.

East Indies Japs Resort To Tortures

Rape and Slaughter Also Follow Realization by Nipponese East Indies Cannot Be Held. Melbourne, March 3.—(AP)—Liberated Dutch and Indonesian prisoners of war newly arrived in Australia say the Japanese, realizing they cannot hold the Indies, have embarked on a wanton campaign of mass torture, rape and slaughter. They said more than 2,000 civilians were held in April, 1944, in Dutch Borneo, among them 12 Australian soldiers.
