Barbering and manicur-ing "on the house" cars and chaufurs but they all had to be imported from such famous Moscow hotels as the Grand and Metropole. The conference setting, the Li-vadia palace grounds, was what Mr. Roosevelt called a combination of Hollywood, Newport and the south. But in stark contrast with it was the devastation of war in evidence on the countryside, skeletons beside the roads and shat-tered, blackened buildings.


