Washington, March 28.—(AP)—Four hundred thousand soft coal miners across the nation ballot today on whether to strike Saturday in protest of a new contract. The vote will be held in 15 states, including a \$400,000,000 a year union.

As the miners voted, on their own time, at mines or other central places, the government sought to avert a mine shutdown by offering a new contract before Saturday midnight. The expiration of the present agreement until May 1.

"Packer was 'misinformed,' he explained. Packers are allowed to charge a percent more for meat sold to hotels and restaurants than for meat sold to retailers. This is the amount necessary to cover the cost of fabricating the meat into smaller cuts for hotels and restaurants.
"Therefore," Bowles declared, "there is no real monetary advantage in selling meat to hotels and restaurants. We might also mention that all restaurants must surrender ration points for their purchases and consequently their most supplies are limited by this rationing program."
"Furthermore, our maximum price regulations provide for quotas on sales of fabricated meat cuts and these quotas are based on a fixed percentage of the sales made during the period of Sept. 15-Dec. 15, 1942. It is apparent, therefore, that the amount of meat which may legitimately be sold to the hotel and restaurant trade is limited.

Roosevelt and Wilson Tariff Stands Similar

Both Plead for Low Levies So Nations of World Can Trade Without Barriers.
By James Marlow
Washington, March 28.—(AP)—Because it is history repeating itself, perhaps, there is an amazing similarity between the words of President Roosevelt this week and of President Woodrow Wilson 24 years ago.
Both men were pleading with Congress for low tariffs so that this nation and the other nations of the world could trade without the economic barriers that strangle the flow of goods.
They said it will be given first. Why they said it will be given next.
Wilson: "Changes of a very radical nature have taken place. The United States has become a great creditor nation."
Roosevelt: "We must recognize, that we are now a creditor country and are destined to be for some time to come."
Wilson: "If we wish to have Europe settle her debts, governments and commercial, we must be prepared to buy from her."
Roosevelt: "Unless we make it possible for Americans to buy goods and services abroad, we are not ready in the markets of the world, it will be impossible for our countries to pay what is owed us."
Wilson: "If we wish to assist Europe and ourselves by the export either of food or raw materials, we must be prepared to buy goods and services abroad, we are not ready in the markets of the world, it will be impossible for our countries to pay what is owed us."
Roosevelt: "Trade is fundamental to the prosperity of nations, as it is to individuals. All of us earn our living by producing for some market, and all of us buy in some market most of the things we need. We do not buy from producers and consumers, when the markets upon which we depend are large and rich and various and competitive as possible. The same is true of nations. We have not always understood this in the United States."
Wilson: "Clearly, this is no time for the erection here of high-tariff barriers... (they) are a vital part in the way of the adjustment of normal business conditions throughout the world, which is as vital to the welfare of this country as to that of all the other nations."
Roosevelt: "We can not succeed in building a peaceful world unless we build an economically healthy world... The reciprocal trade agreement program represents a sustained effort to reduce the barriers which the nations of the world maintained against each other's trade."
Story Behind Statements
This is the story behind those statements.
In 1921 the First World War in Europe was over. American farmers and industrialists, enormously expanded to win that war, were bitterly opposed to any purchases from abroad even though Europe was destitute.
And the Republican Congress—Republicans traditionally have been for high protective tariffs—passed a temporary tariff to protect American agriculture from European competition.
Wilson, just before leaving office, vetoed that tariff act and sent to Congress a veto message which contained the quotations given above. He requested in that temporary measure the basis for a far-reaching and long-range tariff program.
Highest Tariff in History
He went out of office with a 1922 a Republican Congress passed the Fordney-McCumber tariff bill, the highest in our history. And in 1930 another Republican Congress passed the Hawley-Smoot tariff bill, still higher.
Other nations retaliated and erected high-tariff walls of their own. So, our products were kept out of European markets, European products were kept out of America. World trade broke down. The world went into chaos.
All that Wilson had foreseen came true. Europe, indebted to us, could not pay off any debts be-

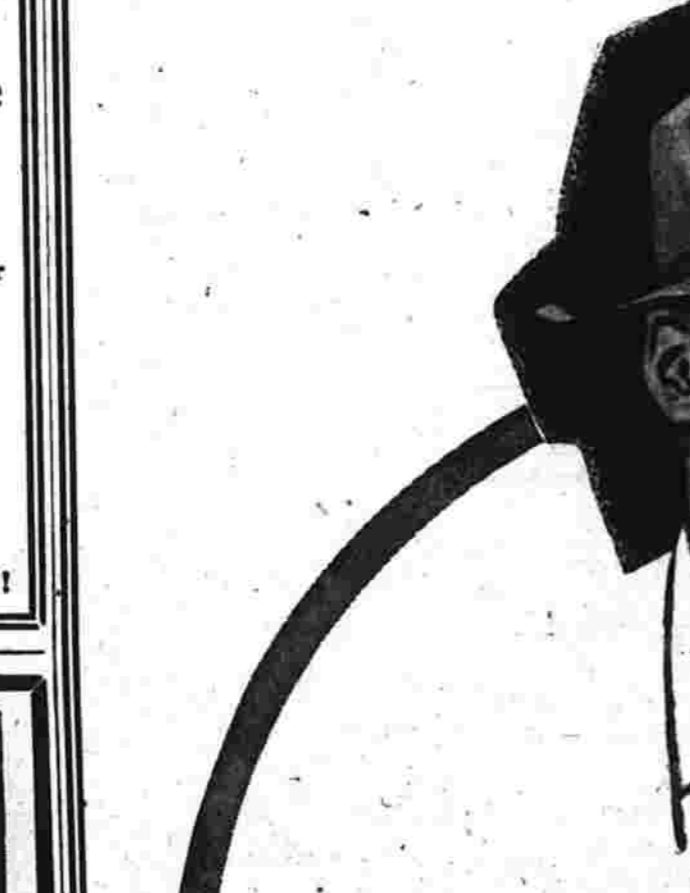
