To supplement the "scarce" fuels, a consumer may receive an additional quantity of any of the "less scarce" solid fuels listed above.

NO DELIVERIES OF SOLID FUELS ARE PERMITTED TO BE MADE TO ANY DOMESTIC CONSUMER AFTER APRIL 1st UNLESS THE CONSUMER HAS FILED A CONSUMER DEC-LARATION WITH HIS DEALER. INFLATING TONNAGE OR DUPLICATING AN ORDER

> Special attention will be given domestic consumers who file their Consumer Declaration and an order with their dealer before May 15th. . If this is done the dealer is required to deliver to the consumers before October 1st at least 30% of their annual requirements of solid fuels, and he may deliver 50% if he is able to do so. The consumer must agree to accept any useable solid fuel. It will be to your advantage to file your Declaration and your order with your dealer before May 15th.


