Assault Across Danube at Third Place; Soviets Tighten Encirclement of Berlin

Bill for Granting Youths Diplomas Passed by House

Concurs With Senate In Adopting Measure To Set Up Machinery For Boys in Service; Assembly Tackles Long Calendar Today.

State Capitol, Hartford, April 24.—(AP)—The House unanimously concurred with the Senate today in approving a bill setting up machinery for Connecticut youths now in the armed forces to get high school diplomas after leaving the service. The measure, which its sponsors said would affect approximately 100,000 youths, was passed by the House without debate as the General Assembly tackled one of the longest calendars of the year.

Authorizes Issuing Diplomas
It authorized the State Board of Education to issue high school diplomas to any veteran who submits satisfactory evidence that he has acquired an education equivalent to that required for high school education, and directs the board to provide free instruction to those who need it to meet the secondary school requirements.

The House tackled its pile of business at once, but the Senate met briefly and then recessed at the request of Democrats after their leader, Senator Leon Ruscitti, announced that he and his colleagues would probably be detained by "a long caucus" to discuss the many proposals on the calendar.

The district court measure, a Democratic-sponsored bill proposing that 33 tribunals be established to replace the present municipal courts, was among the Senate



Third Army's Troops Press to Within 93 Miles of Strongholds of Linz and Salzburg; Seventh Army Closes Down Last 50 Miles Toward Munich; Reduce Three Pockets.

Paris, April 24.—(AP)—The three-Army assault on the outer ramparts of the German Alpine redoubt burst across the Danube at a third place today, overran the traffic center of Ulm and carried to within 105 miles of Hitler's hideout at Berchtesgaden. An American-Russian junction was expected momentarily in the center, splitting Germany.
