**Canada Stock Scheme Told**  
**Warning Given Connecticut Residents on Mine Security Offerings.**

Clarence M. Adams, director of Securities Division of the State of Connecticut, and President of the National Association of State Securities Commissioners, today issued the following warning to Connecticut residents concerning offerings of Canadian mining securities.

"It has come to the attention of the Canadian authorities, prepared that dealers in securities located in Canada, and not registered under either State or Federal Securities Laws are soliciting residents of this state, through appealing literature received by mail, to purchase Canadian securities, principally undeveloped gold mining companies. Such solicitations are usually followed up by means of long-distance telephone calls from Canada, urging the immediate purchase of the security offered. This is true not only in Connecticut, but throughout the United States. In all instances to Canada, it has been said that many of the violations are committed by American citizens operating from Canada, dealers and salesmen engaged in such business with residents of this state. Therefore, such offerings of mining securities to residents of this state without compliance with the laws applicable thereto are illegal.

"The residents of this state are urged to use extreme care and caution, and to carefully investigate such offerings before thinking of making any investment, and then to deal only with duly registered Connecticut brokers and salesmen. If literature or telephone calls are received by residents of this state pertaining to this matter, they should be immediately reported to the Connecticut Securities Division."

**Cash Seizure Found Legal**  
**Gambler's Money Not Any More Sacred Than His Policy Slips.**

Manford's April 23 seizure of gambler's money is no more sacrilegious than the seizure of policy slips, the state Supreme court held today in unanimous opinion.

The high bench, in a decision written by Associate Justice Bill Verrill of Bridgeport, that the state law did not authorize police or the Superior Court to confiscate the gambler's money.

Facts Uncontested

The facts of the case were uncontested. Manford was seized by an officer, without a warrant, as he was making the rounds of a route picking up policy slips. At headquarters before his formal arrest, Manford voluntarily turned over to the officer 238 policy slips and \$178 in cash.

Subsequently Manford pleaded guilty in court to policy playing but contended that the statute authorizing the seizure did not provide for confiscation of his money. He asserted that the seizure was only for the confiscation of slot machines for such other devices used in gambling but did not mention money.

Said Justice Ellis: "The statute authorized the seizing of such slot machines or other devices. It did not authorize the seizure of money. The devices defined in the statute include slot machines, pin-ball machines, book or money used for gambling."

"There is nothing else the word 'such' could refer to. It follows therefore, that the seizure clause authorizes the seizure of money used for gambling."

He asserted that the seizure was only for the confiscation of slot machines for such other devices used in gambling but did not mention money.

"There is nothing else the word 'such' could refer to. It follows therefore, that the seizure clause authorizes the seizure of money used for gambling."
