

Henderson Outlines Six Issues on Points to Give Work Security Deposits De To 60,000,000.

Henderson, former OPA head and present economic advisor to China, last night outlined six points by which, he said, 60,000,000 post-war jobs would be provided.

Speaking before the Norwalk Town Hall forum, the former OPA administrator declared that "bringing the lowest income groups up to the "American standard of living" is of paramount importance in achieving the goal of 60,000,000 jobs. Only by making full employment our united determination and by constructing a workable policy to attain that goal can the necessary jobs be provided. Henderson declared.

Proposes Tax Changes
In addition to raising the living standard of the lowest income groups, he proposed broad tax exemptions for families who spend 100 per cent of their income for living expenses. He recommended complete tax exemption for corporations and broaded taxation of individual incomes in the higher brackets.

The eradication of monopolies and cartels, is another necessary step, he asserted.

As the sixth point in his program he proposed expansion of governmental spending in the fields of old age security, matermity care, education, low income housing, health and other fields of social welfare.
