



Hartford, May 4—(F)—Women outnumbered men by more than six to one at a hearing on the equal-rights-for women amendment to the Federal constitution, but although the ladies did most of the talking they were not unanimously in favor of the proposal, a legislative committee learned yesterday.

The hearing, before the committee on Federal and intergovernmental relations, was on the proposal to memorialize Congress in favor of the pending amendment which says:

"Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex."

Representatives of several women's organizations advanced the argument that adoption of the amendment would serve to countreact some 1,000 laws held to be discriminatory to women.




