Their Part in War Bond Drive Will Again Be an Important One.

Under the leadership of Mrs. John P. Cheney, Jr., chairman of the Women's Division of Manchester War Finance Committee, Manchester will be thoroughly covered by the Fifteen Bond Wagons directed by 15 captains of the women's teams. Each night a different section of Manchester will have the 15 Bond Wagons stationed throughout the streets of the city. The women who will call at every house in that particular neighborhood and invite the people to purchase their War Bonds at the Bond Wagon.

When asked whether the women were in any way disheartened by the amount of \$100,000 in War Bonds to be sold here in Manchester, Mrs. Cheney said: "No, indeed they are not. In fact, the amount to be raised has acted as a challenge to our entire organization and we have made up our mind to sell Bonds as much as possible. Manchester will certainly meet its quota. My team captain reports that the women on the 15 bond wagons are going to make a fine record in former Bond campaigns, and are going to try and beat their own records." "I don't want to say anything that will be wrong in any way," she said, "but I think we are going to do a better job than we did in our former campaigns."
