Ford Tank Engines The simplicity and ruggedness of the direct action non-adjustable camshaft mechanism employed on tank engines made by the Ford Motor Company already has

Examination of nearly 2,000 of the 500-horsepower engines which Army Ordnance has returned to Ford's Lincoln plant for reconditioning reveals a marked resistance to wear under the severest conditions.

Some have run as long as 500 hours - at full throttle most of the time. Despite this, valve stems average only .0003 of an inch wear and valve guides .0005 of an inch.

Wear of pushrod surfaces, which usually is excessive, was neglible. This despite the fact that a pressure of 180 pounds is exerted on the surface every time it is struck by the cam. At full load this occurs 1,300 times a minute, the cams revolving at one-half the crankshaft speed. More than 20,000 of these engines already have been produced at Ford's Lincoln plant. Production is continuing at full speed.

The Ford tank engine camshaft assembly is a refinement of racing car and aviation designs. Moving parts have been reduced from approximately 80 to 30. Valve clearances are permanently set on the factory assembly. Tank engine crews can be certain their tappets are set at the maximum point of efficiency and that they will remain there without adjustment.

Improved lubrication has been achieved by drilling larget oil holes and increasing their number. This literally bathes the camshafts in oil.

Moving parts have been reduced to a minimum. A crankshaft driven worm gear operates two hourglass worms. These in turn operate vertical drive shafts. Hourglass worms at the opposite ends of the shafts actuate two gears attached to the exhaust and intake valve camshafts. Reversing the usual arrangement, steel gears are employed on the driving ends of the vertical shafts, where maximum thrust is required, with bronze gears on the camshafts.

The unique pushrod construction is another note-worthy feature of this fighting engine. Variations in tap-pet clearances due to the expansion of the pushrod itself under operating temperatures are negligible, expansion being relatively low. In addition, the Ford tank engine pushrod eliminates all side thrust on valve stems, permitting the valve to move freely in its guide. Moreover, since the pushrod rotates, wear from contact with the
