Why Divorces Are Increasing
A few years ago, the increasing divorce rate and the vague Paris divorce was alarming, but even then I felt that we must attack the problem of ex-marriage rather than that of easy divorce. Marriage is to be saved, those who enter it, must be made to realize its importance beforehand.

Divorces grow, frequently
out of the inability of two people to merge into a single entity. This is usually because they are completely unacquainted. Naturally that is why the Latin Church Around the Corner refuses to marry people who know little of one another and who are starting marriage under a terrific handicap.

I mean that that our fathers
are so much higher than they used to be that it becomes increasingly hard to live up to them. It used to be that, when a man and woman were married, the money-aid the woman did as he told her, spent what he allowed her on her ambitions, hopes, children, belonged to her husband and her family, without regard to her own ambitions, hopes, and ideals.

Now that we have got rid of slavery
of the wife, both men and women are excited from the marriage in which freedom, growth, and service cannot play a part. That is why we see so many divorces. Marriage is not a feudal arrangement, it is a partnership between a husband or wife.

Marriage is for better or for worse. I tell people that they should not unduly exult the Seventh Commandment as the only important one of the 10. Too few people realize that it is a result of the fight against sex that began when the sacral influence entered the early Church, that they still tend to make sex morality the only test of virtue.

I am not making any moral
control in sex, but I am saying the marriage with intention, and with mutual understanding, as the prayer book says, "for better or for worse."

Personally, while I believe
firmly that marriage should be a permanent relationship, I think that when people are too utterly unlike, it is criminal to keep them together. There are always exceptional cases for which divorce should be made a mere elastic.

I remember one young woman
who came to me in despair, "What shall I do?" she said. "My husband is an old weakling. I can't break him of his habit of drinking, and he is a most offensive person when he is drunk. My love for him is dead. My respect for him is dead. I have nothing but my marriage vows which I took for better or for worse."

"Drinking," I said, "is a weak
person's escape from his own inadequacy. Does he love you?" "Yes," she said promptly. "I mean everything to him, but that is not enough to give him the strength to stop drinking. What am I to do if I cannot get a divorce which the church will recognize?"

Mental cruelty is one of the
wildest things in the world. I mean by this real mental cruelty, not merely the blanket charge of the Reno divorce courts. The underlying antagonism of one person can make a marriage hell.

That is why, I repeat, often
the injunction: Be friends! Of all relationships, friendship is the enduring and the most satisfying.
