

Ford Employees Rationing

Approximately 20,000 gasoline and tire ration appli-cations from employees of 23 Ford Motor Company plants in the Detroit area each month flow through a Ford-designed network of transportation offices.

Last November 21,555 gas ration applications were processed; in January 21,654, and 15,666 in the short month of February.

In June, 1944 there were 3,761 tire certificates secured for Ford employees. In July 5,717 were obtained and 7,160 in August. Tire wear lessened during the winter-and in January only 1,966 certificates were obtained and 2,888 in February. Ford workers receive about 200 pairs of work and safety shoes a month and applications for them also are handled through the boards.

From Detroit area plants, Ford employe ration applications are sent to an office in the Ford Administration Building, Dearborn, where an expediter sees that they reach the Central War Area Board in downtown Detroit, This organization is staffed by workers loaned by industries to assist with the tire, gas, new cars, and shoe applications.
