### Coscia Tells Court Story

#### Trial Delayed Today Because of Short Calendar Session.

Waterbury, June 15.—Because of the usual Friday morning short calendar session in Superior court today, the trial of Domenic Coscia for the shotgun slaying of his brother-in-law, Adolph Cyr last Sept. 28 will not resume until 2 p. m.

Coscia, testifying under direct examination by Attorney Edward Macoco, his counsel, in his own defense, spent more than four hours on the witness stand yesterday, being there at 4:30 p. m.

### Denise Pulls Trigger

He denied to Judge John A. Corbett and jury that he had pulled the trigger of the shotgun with which the state charges Cyr was slain, as alleged to a quarrel allegedly resulting from Cyr's objection to nose Coscia made in the cellar of a house jointly occupied by them.

The state claims Coscia smashed a panel in a door in the Cyr apartment, inserted the gun and pulled the trigger, fatally wounding his brother-in-law.

Claiming that someone he could not see grabbed the gun barrel from inside the Cyr kitchen, Coscia said the weapon was pulled

back and forth several times through the hole in the door. He said he broke the panel of the door by pounding on it with the muzzle of the gun. Coscia speaks brookly.

"I pull and pull and pull," he said. "Boom—it goes off." The recoil, he said, knocked the gun from his hands.

"Did you pull the trigger," Macoco asked him.

"No, no," Coscia said. "When I take the gun away I see Cyr on the floor. I lose my mind. . . . I lose everything. I no intend to shoot Cyr."

"Did you pull the trigger at any time?" Macoco questioned.

"No. . . . My mind upside down."

Rockville Home Service On Increase
Rockville Report Will Show a Tremendous Boost in Cases.

Rockville, June 15.—(Special)—A Home Service report issued this week by the Rockville Red Cross Chapter shows the tremendous increase in this type of work during the first six months of 1945.

During the first six months of 1945 a total of 88 cases were handled by the corps while the same months period of 1944 the number of cases completed were 122.

To point out a little more graphically the amount of work this corps does, the various workers recently put in a total of 211 hours on 31 cases.

In this Red Cross Home Service report it is noted that the Service by Civilians is the branch that has grown with six cases in January and 45 in May of this year.
