



Hartford, July 12-(A) - The socalled "second injury fund" bill, legislation sponsored by organized. labor as being advantageous to job-seeking, partially incapacitat-ed war veterans, has been signed into law by Governor Baldwin. The measure, which received the chief executive's signature yesterday, provides in effect that physically handicapped employes will be entitled to the same workmen's compensation benefits as are enjoyed by other workers. Under old statutes, employer were disinclined to hire physically handicapped persons because they were considered to be more pronto suffer injury, or they were compelled to sign waivers of rights to workmen's compensa

The bill sets up a second injury fund of \$50,000 which will be financed by contributors from companies writing workmen's compensation insurance and from self-insuring employers based on the amount of claims they paid under the workmen's compensa-tion act for the preceding year.




