

### Traffic Cases To Be Studied

Greene Says 'Puzzling' Situation Has Arisen In State This Year.

Hartford, July 27-(49)-William f. Greene, director of the Highway Safety Commission, says a "most puzzling" situation has de-veloped Connecticut's traffic ag-cident experience which he interprets as indicating that the police or the courts are not fulfilling their jobs.
Therefore, Greene disclosed yesterday, he has started a survey to find out why court cases involv-ing traffic accidents were 43 per

cent fewer during the first six months of 1945 than in the same period of 1944 when traffic acci-dents increased 27 per cent during the same period and the number of driver involved in accidents increased 33 per cent.

Asserting "the situation certainly calls for examination," Greene said he would submit the results his survey to the commission for whatever action it may decide to take officially.

Greene said he intended to examine a list of traffic arrests made by police departments during the first half of the year and compare t with reports filed by courts with the state Department of Motor Vehicles to determine whether all drivers arrested actually were appearing in court.






