## MORE FORD TRUCKS NOW FOR PRIORITY HOLDERS

New trucks are becoming more easily available to farmers and business men with legitimate needs than they have been since the beginning of the war. Stewart Dillon, prorictor of Dillon Sales and Service, disclosed today.

Citing the increased tempo of production, of truck equipment in Detroit, Mr. Dilion said that he looks forward to a general relaxation of the requirements set by the Office of Defense Transportation for the issuance of priorities, necessary for the purchase of new-trucks.

This expected relaxation by ODT in granting of new truck priorities is encouraging in view of the fact that so many businessmen and farmers, who depend so much upon their trucks, are facing next winter with uncertain equip-ment," he said. "I would like to urge all those who depend upon their trucks to make a careful check now to detarmine if they can last through another cold season. If this check-up reveals that new equipment is necessary they should apply for a priority now while new trucks are available."

The immediate availability of trucks, Mr. Dillon cuntioned, should not be interpreted as an indication that new cars will soon begin to appear here.

"It is true," he said, "that the manufacturers have begun making new cars. But this work is so limited that the chances for buying a new car are still very remote. In the second half of this year," he explained, "the Ford Motor Company has been assigned a quota of only 39 910 new cars, and in the first half of 1946 the quota will be 19.820. Naturally, these cars will be sold only to high priority holders. Therefore, keeping cars in the best running condition is extremely argent for those who depend heavily on them for transportation."




