Idle Pay Benefit

Hartford, Sept. 18.—(A)—A total of 123,529 unemployment compensation claims of all types were filed in Connecticut during August, an increase of 175 per cent over July, State Labor Commissioner John J. Egan disclosed today.

Of the total, he said, 59,226 were initial claims, while there were 10,300 claims for servicemen's readjustment allowances, and 52,667 continuing claims.

The August total of new claims, Egan asserted, was the highest since January, 1938, the first month claims were taken, when 93.128 initial claims were filed.

More than half of the weekly average of 23,087 claimants, the labor commissioner said, were women, and the average benefit check for August was \$20.15. Net benefits for the month totaled \$425,870.
