





The response of the economy to adequate spending hinges largely on the behavior of wages and prices, but we have been backward about studying this particular problem of relationships. Abusiness policy of large sales at low profit margins is clearly favorable to full employment; and this seems to require not only enlightened understanding on the part of business of the importance of this policy, but also the pressible of competition, which can be effective even though "imperfect." (But many farm prices, union wages, freight and electric power rates, etc., are hardly determined by competition). Some monopolistic prices or wages are sure to be set high enough to obstruct full employment; and direct restrictions on production, or on accessio trades, often clearly have this effect. This is especially the case where union and employer become virtual partners, charging the cost of high wages, with a good profit, to the customer.




