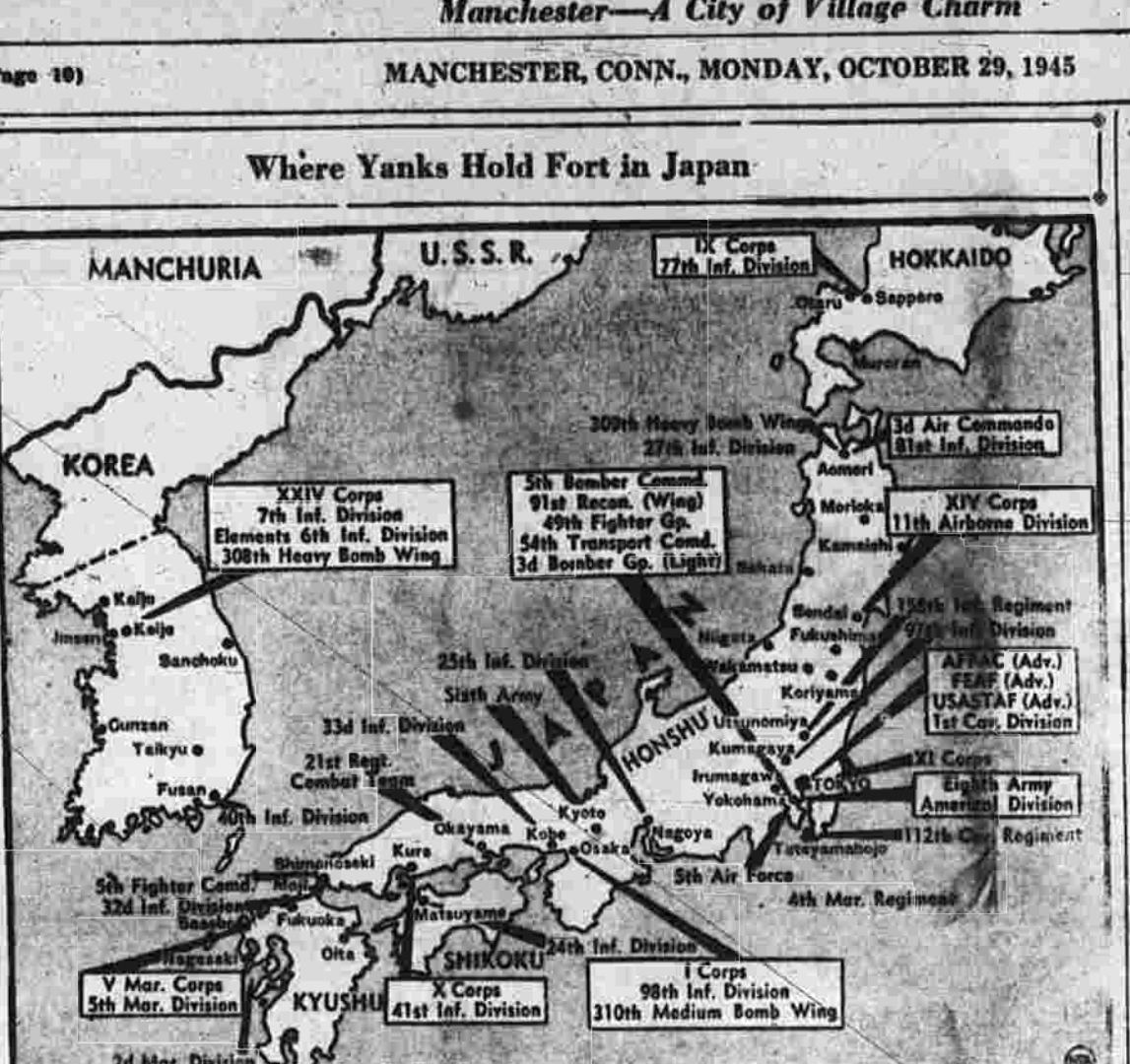

Rockville, Oct. 29.—(Special)—With double lines extending from the entrance of the new Rockville City hospital through the grounds and through the gates along Union street for a considerable distance, the building was open for inspection before 9 o'clock opening time, until after 6 o'clock, the closing time, Sunday afternoon, several thousand persons visited the new hospital located in the former Maxwell mansion, the home of the late William and Miss J. Alice Maxwell, and everywhere was heard favorable comment. Included among the visitors were former residents and residents of neighborhood homes, together with members of the medical profession.

Mrs. Emma Smith, superintendent of the hospital, and her entire staff, including nurses and orderlies, were on hand to escort visitors through the building and explain the opening of a new hospital. ### Wants Fruits To Be Public's

Washington, Oct. 29.—(AP)—President Truman wants Congress to make sure that any scientific discoveries stemming from federally-financed research will become public property.

His position was outlined in a letter written by Reconstruction Director John W. Snyder to Secretary of Agriculture Henry Wallace, who is heading hearings on a proposal to create a national research foundation.

The letter, made public today, said the president believes that the fruits of research financed by Federal funds should be made fully and publicly available to all.

Mr. Truman said to favor writing this principle clearly in any scientific and legislation Congress may enact.

It is the president's opinion, Snyder continued, "that one of the major functions of a Federal research agency must be to coordinate Federal research activities so as to achieve a balanced and effective program. This would not interfere with the separate research programs of the several Federal agencies, but would be intended to assure their effective synchronization."

Scientists' White Battle

The letter also showed that scientists have lost a White House battle for the right to select the head of the proposed national research foundation. They have wanted to select their own leaders for any such program.

Snyder endorsed the foundation idea but said he would not feel "the agency should be under the direction of a single administrator in the country. Both the administrator and the board should be appointed by the president."

The president believes that it would be unwise to leave the administration of the agency to a commission composed of a variety of outside interests.
