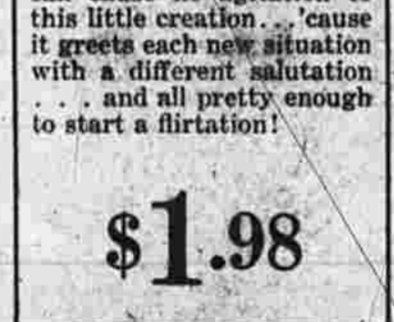

Cairo, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Anti-Zionist riots broke out in Cairo again today but were swiftly suppressed by police. Heavy patrols remained on duty throughout the city to prevent further renewal of the bloody violence which yesterday cost six lives in Alexandria and left hundreds wounded in Cairo, Alexandria, Port Said and other Egyptian cities.

**Bruce Seeks Miners' Help**

**Dire Need of Coal Results in Repatriation Priorities Program**

Sapporo, Hokkaido, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Dire need of coal for the winter spurred Maj. Gen. A. D. Bruce, commander of the U. S. 77th Infantry division, to seek the help yesterday to Chinese and Korean miners by offering them repatriation priorities.

"You are in the mines and while you occupy workers' houses, it is absolutely impossible to bring Japanese coal miners here. I order the Japanese coal mine operators and police to treat you fairly and benevolently as citizens of free countries," he said.

However, he ordered the Chinese and Koreans not to harm Japanese coal miners, their families, police operators or to ride the railroads without paying Japanese police were given power to arrest criminals who Bruce said would be the last to be returned home.

**Ready to Meet Transfer Goal**

Frankfurt, Nov. 3.—(AP)—The U. S. Army stands ready to meet the June 1 goal which President Truman has set for transfer of the American occupation zone government from military to civilian hands.

The government officials welcomed word that a civilian government or high commission would take over under the State department or some other designated agency. Secretary of State General Eisenhower on down does not look forward to the transfer with joy.

The goal announced by President Truman was set at a meeting of the American occupation zone government and will not affect the military occupation.

Simultaneous switchovers from military to civilian rule in all four occupation zones would be desirable, military government officials believe, and perhaps the Russians would appreciate the value of concurrent action. The French attitude they term uncertain.

**Statement Not Given by Maher**

Bridgeport, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Admiral W. H. B. Denny, U. S. Navy, chairman, asserted that he had authorized no statement that he might withdraw as a possible successor to Federal District Attorney Robert P. Butler.

Following published reports Thursday that "it appeared" he had virtually removed himself as a candidate for the \$6,000-a-year post, Maher said he was questioned by newsmen about it and he had told them that he had "absolutely no statement to make at this time."

There had been some speculation as to whether Maher would accept the job if offered to him since U. S. Attorney General Tom Clark's recent announcement that he planned to prohibit all district attorneys from engaging in private practice.

Maher, saying that any statement about his possible withdrawal "without any authorization from me" asserted he had never been offered the post; and that he knew nothing of the conditions on which he would be required to accept it should the appointment be offered to him.

**Veteran Pitches Tents in Park**

Los Angeles, Nov. 3.—(AP)—David Mizrahi, veteran of Marine Corps action in the South Pacific, folded his tent in a downtown park Thursday night and quietly left with his wife and small son.

The Marine veteran told reporters the housing shortage had forced him to shelter his family by pitching a pup tent in Pershing Square park Thursday. But city authorities, mindful of an ordinance prohibiting habitation in public parks, ordered him to leave by midnight.

Mizrahi, his wife Sophie, and their son, Bobbie, 2, picked up their tent, a few blankets and a toy telephone and left at 10 p. m. The Mizrahis, both 23, said they had been looking for an apartment since last March when he was discharged from the Marines. He is now working as an upholsterer and they had been living with relatives.

**Criminal Offenses Jump in Nation**

Washington, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Criminal offenses jumped 10.3 per cent during the first nine months of 1945 compared with the same period of 1944, the FBI said yesterday.

Crimes in September increased 15.8 per cent compared with September, 1944. From January through September, murder and non-negligent manslaughter increased 7.8 per cent, manslaughter by negligence 6.6 per cent, rape 7.8, robbery 17.5, aggravated assault 8.8, burglary 25.4, larceny 8.4 and automobile theft 14.2.
