### Major Engine Details Told

Pratt-Whitney Develops Most Powerful Aircraft Engine in World

Hartford, Nov. 28.—The most powerful aircraft engine developed in production anywhere in the world—Pratt & Whitney Aircraft's Wasp Major—was disclosed as the power plant for the bulk of the giant new fighters and top military aircraft of the immediate future.

Delivering in excess of 3600 combat horsepower, the Major has been selected to power these commercial sky gliders:

The 100-Passenger, four-engine Douglas C-74 Globemaster; The 114-Passenger, four-engine Boeing Model 477 Stratoliner, the commercial version of the Superfortress; The 8-engine Hughes Hercules seaplane, the world's largest aircraft, now being assembled on the West Coast.

Since the Wasp Major is particularly useful in big, long-range airplanes because of its superior fuel consumption characteristics, it is to power two of the Army's heaviest bombers, the B-29 Superfortress, two of the Navy's crack, single-engine fighters, the Grumman F6F Corsair, and the Boeing F8B, also use this engine to obtain altitudes and performance not yet provided by any other type of powerplant. At least six Army and Navy airplanes have not yet publicly announced, are also being developed around one or more of these engines.

Engineers at Pratt & Whitney Aircraft, who designed more than 50 per cent of all the aircraft engines used by the United States in World War II, believe that the presently announced power output of the Major, which has a piston displacement of 4360 cubic inches, does not represent the ultimate possibilities for the engine. They point out that the smaller, 18-cylinder, 2800-cubic inch Double Wasp has delivered, in combat operations, well in excess of 2900 horsepower. While the production rate of the Wasp Major, which slackened temporarily with the general termination of war contracts when Japan capitulated, now is being stepped up to meet current demands, there has been no such interruption of the engine's development program.

Cylinder Arrangement

The Major's 28 cylinders are arranged in four rows of seven cylinders each, giving the engine a frontal area greater than that of the 18-cylinder Double Wasp, a two-row radial engine with a basic rating of 2100 horsepower. Indeed, the new engine is only one inch larger in diameter than the original Wasp, which delivered 410 horsepower back in 1925. A belief in the arrangement of the new cylinders about the crankcase projects each individual cylinder into the air stream and gives the big engine better cooling characteristics than most one- and two-row engines.

Development of the engine was accelerated and encouraged by low experimental and production contracts from both Army and Navy. Because of the urgency of military demands and wartime telescoping of engineering activity, less than five years have elapsed since the project was authorized late in 1940. The first engine was run in April 1941. The Major first

# Sees Britain's Program For Youth in Operation

## Local Girl Delegate To World Conference Studies Achievements Nation Has Made

Miss Anna Postma, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. P. O. Postma of 33 West Drive, a delegate representing the University of the International Youth Congress in London, arrived in London on Monday. She is the only American girl attending the conference.

Following the conference in London, she will attend the Youth Congress in Moscow, the Youth Congress in the Soviet Republics, and the Moscow conference Miss Postma hopes to get a passport to Holland to visit relatives whom she has never seen.

London Visit

In between the meetings of the congress in London the delegates were able to inspect some of the remarkable achievements which Britain has made in the organization of youth work as a happier nation.

For the war has been a dead end for the young people of Britain are concerned. The delegates are seeing the new youth institutes and colleges, the new youth centers and the new youth centers which are being built in Britain during the war, and which are being turned to civilian use for the young people.

The delegates to the London Congress have seen how thousands of American and other Allied servicemen are also taking part in the ambitious training schemes. American youth are taking part in special technical classes and lectures which teach such widely diverse subjects as interior decoration, machine engineering, public speaking, work relations, music, finance, choreography and machine shop practice.

Continue Activities

British government has taken a number of steps to see that the immense activities of young people during the war years are not now abruptly stopped. Instead, the government is making every effort to carry on a permanent feature of British life.

During the war young people worked in the war plants, tended the guns, ran part time "home factories" and are now sending their own countries, after the war, into a by-liberated Europe.

The authorities hope that all this energy will not now be lost to the nation. They have planned to harness it as part of the general scheme to put Britain on her feet again.

The accent on youth is being made particularly in trade and industry. Youth is being encouraged to make itself felt in every branch of commerce.

Many great industries—cotton, airplanes, mining, car, plastics, radio, in mention only a few—have since VE-day started scholarship and bursary schemes to enable promising youngsters to attend the universities or technical colleges, and get the training for eventual executive positions.

Teaching Aircraft Service

The firm which produced the famous Mosquito plane has started its own technical school, teaching aerodynamics and pilot design. The company which makes the engines for the British naval aircraft is spending more than \$10,000 a year on helping promising teen-age newcomers in the firm to qualify for jobs.

The call to youth is also being sounded by the government. Sir Stafford Cripps, who has the tremendous task of seeing that Britain's industry convert quickly and efficiently to peace has hit on the idea of starting what he calls "working parties" in each industry to supply ideas for reconstruction. In each of these working parties he has tried to secure as large a number of young people as possible.

Encourage New Blood

An official committee which was recently set up to study the question of increasing Britain's industrial efficiency, stressed that the average age of directors of industry was far too high. These older men pulled Britain through the dark years of the war, but the need for new blood is apparent. Happily the situation is being remedied today as it was after World War I when a large proportion of the generation of youth was wiped out. In the war just ended not so many young men have died. Many are available to take the place of their fathers. These younger men are in tune with the great technical progress which has been made as a result of war urgency. The fundamental need in all the schemes for harnessing the great supply of youthful energy is to "catch them even younger." That is what Britain is doing, and that is what the delegates to the Youth Congress in London are seeing. It is an opportunity to see in action and to study.

# Marshall Receives Fill-in on Truman Program in China

(Continued from Page One)

Marshall has said repeatedly in recent weeks that United States policy toward China had been under critical review before Hurley's resignation. He said that the danger of a Communist takeover might be actively involved in the fight between Chinese government and Chinese Communist forces.

In connection with that review, it appeared likely that before Marshall's departure from Washington, Truman would have fresh information on the Chinese situation from two sources.

Under Secretary of the Navy Arthur H. Gages is due in Washington momentarily from the Far East. He told reporters at Ford Hall Monday that he would "make specific recommendations to the president on the Chinese situation."

Edwin A. Locke, personal representative of the president, also is expected to return from Chungking after touring China for the last two months on an economic mission.

Marshall himself was due at the White House on Monday, but he was a reference Mr. Truman and Byrnes.

The president, who has recalled Marshall as the greatest military figure the world has ever known—called the general at his Leesburg, Va., home to ask him to lead the charge.

White House Press Secretary Charles O. Ross described the assignment as one "to do a particular job that needs to be done in China." Marshall will leave soon, Ross added.

The former chief of staff served several tours of duty in China and attended several Anglo-American conferences during the war.

Hurley Schedules Talk

Hurley, meanwhile, scheduled a week-long luncheon tour before members of the National Press club.

At the same time, Hurley's weekly news conference at noon afforded him an opportunity to reply to Hurley's contentions yesterday that American carrier diplomats had sided with both the Chinese Communists and an "imperialist bloc" to hamstring U. S. foreign policy in the Far East.
