By the terms of the Bowers bill, the attorney general of the state would he empowered, upon recom-mendation of a General Assembly committee and the Governor, to hring a petition directly to the Supreme Court of Errors seeking its advice on the legality of any measure pending before the Gen-eral Assembly. The bill states that its purpose is "to facilitate the passage and effectiveness of sound legislation."
