The officers want an injunction restraining the union from presenting testimony from its Secretary, Treasurer, Albert Cornell in Superior court, after which the proceedings were postponed because Julius Enspack, secretary-treasurer of the union, was on bond to tell about what took place at the local's meeting. The charter revocation order was decided upon.
