Chief Justice Vinson delivered the opinion of the majority.

Justices Murphy and Rutledge wrote dissenting opinions.

Justice Frankfurter wrote a concurring opinion. Justices Black and Douglas each wrote an opinion in which they concurred in part and dissented in part.

The court majority ruled that neither the Norris-LaGuardia act nor the war labor disputes act barredthe government from obtaining the injunction while resulted in the contempt proceedings.

It was this injunction that Lewis and the miners union were accused of flouting.
