

Hartford, March 7-(P)-Sena-tor Rocco D. Pallotti (D-Hartford) apparently is making a lone wolf fight for a chain store tax.

That was the impression created yesterday at a General Assembly Finance committee hearing during which Pallotti contended that chain stores were "big business" driving small retailers to the wall.

Pallotti, advocating a tax ranging from \$100 to \$500 depending upon the number of stores in upon the number of stores in a chain, asserted that the levy would be "only a drop in the bucket" to

The Hartford senator said he unerstood that Gov. James L. Mc-Conaughy (R) was receptive to alternatives to the administration's sales tax proposal, which was strongly condemned at a turbulent public hearing Tuesday. Pallotti added the chain store levy would be one way of helping to "dig up

enough revenue." Many Oppose Proposal No one else present, however, rose to support his idea, while, on the other hand many spoke against it, including representalives of chain store organizations. Pallotti's proposal followed a hearing on administration sponsored measures which would raise the hard liquor tax from \$1 to 1.50 a gallon and add an estimat d \$2,000,000 annually to the state

Nobody favored that proposition either. Liquor interests denounced it, said it would stimulate "bootlegging," asserted hard liquor al-ready was taxed to "the starvation point" and 'advocated increased levies on wine and beer. State Tax Commissioner Walter Walsh disagreed with those who urged a boost in the present \$1 a barrel tax on beer, but conceded that the current dime-a-gallon levy

on wines was "far out of line." Sales Tax In Spotlight

Warning Is Issued On Unpaid Taxes

Tax Collector Samuel Nelson last night mailed 45 notices of intent to place liens on unpaid property tax on the list of 1945, which still remain unpaid. This does not mean that the liens will be placed against the property on April 1 as Mr. Nelson feels that several of the 45 so notified will probably pay the taxes with the nterest before April 1. Unless the payments are made by April 1 on these taxes the Tax Collector must, by law, file liens against the property. By giving the notice now of his intent to do so, Mr. Nelson gives an opportunty to pay the cost of the tax and the interest accrued, and save the additional cost of filing a lien.
