Hopes to Take Dairen Soon

Government Believes It Will Have to Fight Chinese Reds

Nanking, March 25.—(AP)—Government sources said today China hoped to take over Dairen from Russia within two weeks but a foreign office spokesman implied it might be necessary to fight the Chinese Communists for the big port.

The spokesman, Chang Yuan-zang, reserved comment on Washington's announcement yesterday that Russia was ready to "take appropriate steps" to turn over the Manchurian port under terms of its treaty with China.

Before government troops (now camped 15 miles outside the city) can take over, "certain obstacles" must be removed, Chang said in a press conference.

It was known that highest Chinese officials were conferring on the subject but reliable sources declined to give details.

Foreign office sources steadfastly refused to admit Dairen was a subject of international negotiations with Russia, pointing out that the question was fully covered by the Chinese-Russian treaty.

Chinese quarters in Shanghai, being unofficial, were less reticent. They openly expressed fear that Russian troops might pull out of Dairen suddenly, and that Chinese Communists in control.

They believed Chinese officials are making every effort to induce Moscow to avoid such a course.

While the Communists have believed deployment in strength between government troops and Dairen, the city could be taken over smoothly if the Russians allowed the government to enter by sea.

In any event, Gen. Tu Li-ming, government commander in Manchuria, is known to have sufficient troops and equipment to batter his way into Dairen, past the Communists, but it is feared a fight might cause considerable damage to the port.

There are no reliable estimates of Communist strength on the Kwantung peninsula, surrounding Dairen. Pre-government assessments ranged from 50,000 to 100,000 but foreign observers believe the figure is too high.

All accounts here agree that Russia, during many months of the occupation of Dairen, has stripped industrial plants—much

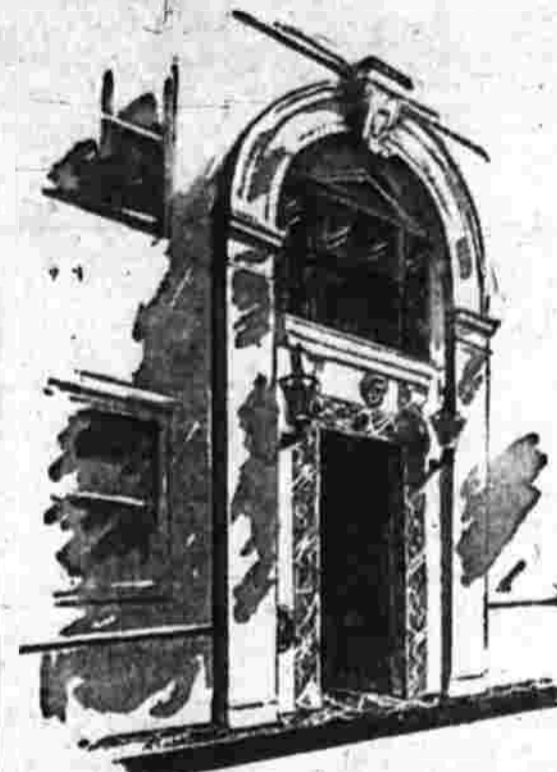

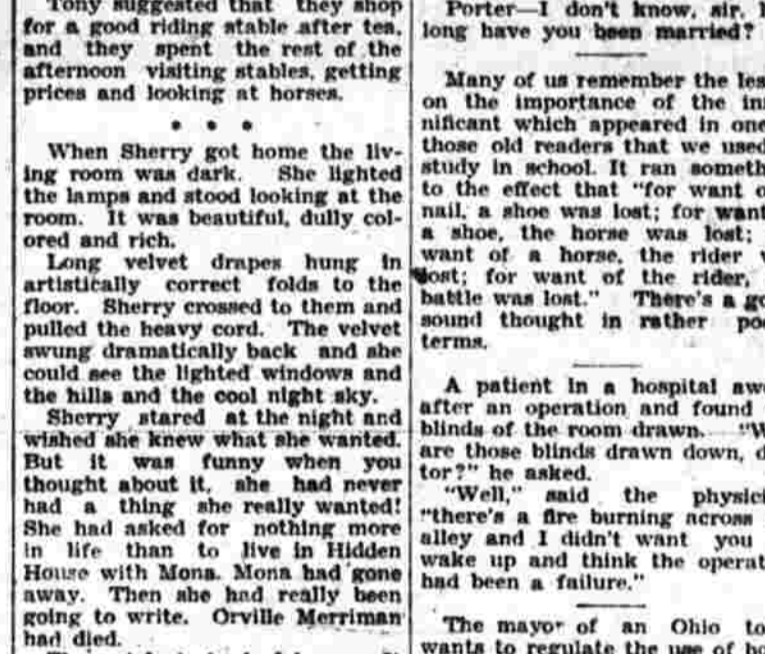

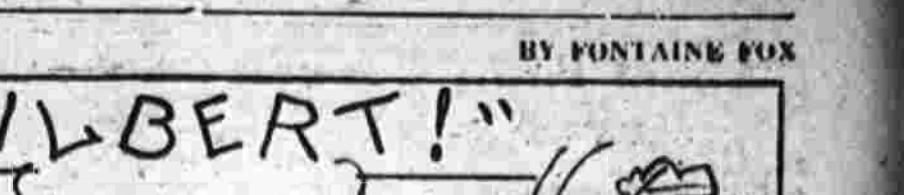
