At this particular moment, we are immersed in a so-called "Greek crisis." Actually, the American policy proposed in this instance is merely one more of the many steps American policy has taken in the last few years. It is an important and climactic step which threatens to crystallize our national action. If we now approve this policy, we are in effect presenting to us, we will lose more and more of our chance of decision in the future.

The way this particular policy has been presented to us—which is, naturally, right or wrong, or play into the hands of Russia—seems to have been directly designed to nullify our power and privilege of national analysis and decision.

Having the Truman Greek policy presented to us in such a fashion makes it difficult enough for the people of this country to make up their minds as to what to do. Yet, unless we see what opportunity they have now, the next chance will be still more difficult. Let us not be tricked to blind and callous acceptance of this climactic step of an American policy which we shall be locked into a course of action which, no matter what we may tell ourselves, about our motives and intentions, we are as rigidly determined for us as was the decision of the German nation determined once it first accepted Hitler.

As for our leaders, even the outright militarists among them are well-intentioned. They do not seek war, but the prevention of war. It is the world's tragedy that their idea of how to prevent war happens to be a bold pursuit of the very policy which must lead to war. It is the world's tragedy that they have not inherited their eyes and their minds from battleships and bombs, from force and murder, to those ideals and concepts which alone can save us.

They are all "practical" men, and it will be their final virtue that they are very well "prepared" for the ending of civilization, as well as for their epitaph, if any such scribbles be left in this world, that they prepared for it so efficiently that they brought it on.

At some point or other—and there is no point better than the present, since each succeeding point of opportunity has been snatched and more difficult to seize—these leaders too must be brought to a halt and be forced to contemplate the good alternatives.

These good alternatives we should all consider together, and yet as old as human religion, and yet they have a modernity, and more urgent than that of the atom bomb. Only by giving these good alternatives our vision and our loyalty can we hope to see through the atmosphere of fear and dread and suspicion which is now ruling mankind. Only by adopting the policies of peace and working toward it with the aid of reconstructed spirit can we
