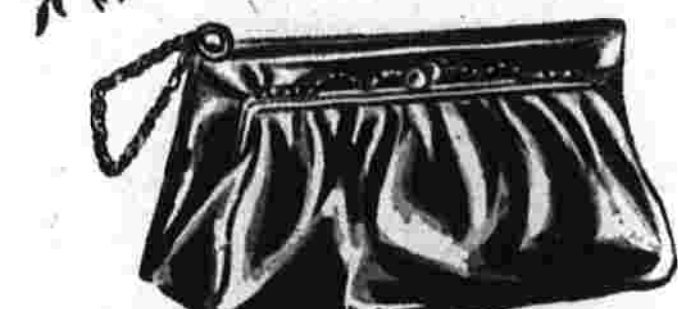

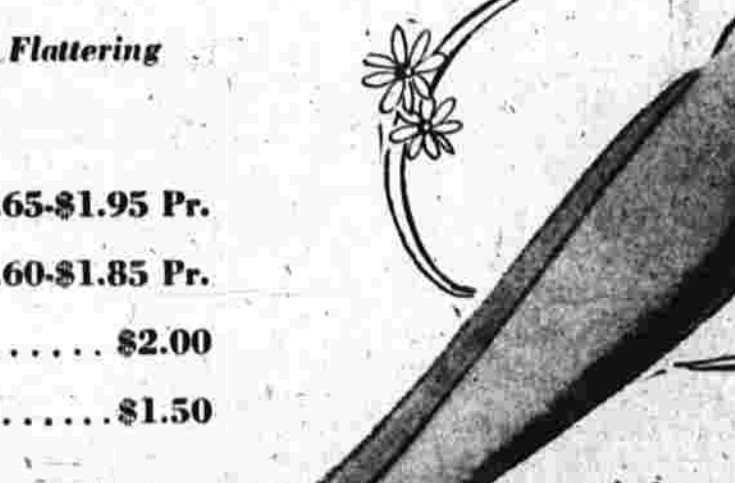

Ouster for Krug Sought by Lewis; 518 Mines Closed

United Mine Workers Chief Denounces Secretary of Interior as 'Dishonorable' Politician; Closing Ordered For Safety Reasons

Washington, April 3.—John L. Lewis today denounced Secretary of Interior Krug as a "dishonorable" politician and demanded congressional action to oust him from office.

40,000 Miners Involved This action involved about 40,000 miners who produce daily 350,000 tons of soft coal.

Lewis said Krug's order belatedly referred to those responsible for some 4,000 letters and telegrams he has received, all signed by members of a \$2,500,000 slush in customs funds voted by the House.

Washington, April 3.—Admiral J. F. Farley declared today a \$30,000,000 slush in Coast Guard funds for the next fiscal year may lead to ship losses which would exceed that saving by Congress.

Lewis proposed that Congress adopt a resolution calling on President Truman to remove Krug from office. In addition, he recommended that Congress:

1. Enact promptly legislation making it mandatory for Federal mine inspectors to close pits found to be violating laws for Federal safety standards.

2. Authorize the United States Treasury to return to the United Mine Workers the \$750,000 fine imposed on the union by the Supreme court for contempt of court order in a "unitary" strike.

Lewis suggested putting the money in a trust to care for widows and children of the Centralia disaster and those who died in a mine tragedy two years ago at Straight Creek, Ky.

The mine leader went before the committee to discuss mine safety. He was interrupted by the testimony of Truman's budget recommendations and whittled to \$7,000,000 by the House committee.

Washington, April 3.—Democratic leaders apparently carried the blessings of President Truman today in an effort to patch up party differences on the subject of one hand by former Vice President Wallace and other Democrats.

Byrd, who is widely regarded as taking a more conservative line, was invited along with leaders from four other states to the first of a series of national committee meetings.

Sinking Fund On Bond Issue

Opinion Divided on the Method of Financing Our School Program

The proposals brought up this week in public hearing incident to the school situation here, have raised ringing questions and alternatives, should a new building program be voted by the town.

While it has been considered by town officials that such a program probably would be financed by a long term bond issue, the selectmen on Tuesday night appeared receptive to the idea of a sinking fund from which school costs might be paid.

The difference, of course, is that with a bond issue the funds are available at once while to get a sinking fund to draw on such a fund must first be built up over a period of time.

The town's bonded indebtedness is about \$120,000, all incurred for previous school costs. There is an additional bonded debt, that of the town water department, but this is a self-liquidating debt and has not figured directly in the tax matters of the town.

Would Need Two Million

Therefore, without going over the statutory limit the town would have to seek a new school, two or three years previously proposed amounting to about \$1,000,000. But it was pointed out Tuesday, within four or five years a new high school would be needed, another million, will be needed.

Electricity Subsidy

Electricity subsidies have been mentioned in a few years the town is going to have another million dollars in added school costs and these, too, should not be taken on as a loan or bonded proposition.

Would Build Another School

Bonds or loans, he said, eventually add about 2 1/2 per cent to the cost of any project through interest. Thus the new million dollar proposition for two new schools, if bonded, he considered, would in reality cost two hundred thousand beyond the original layout.

For this interest, another good school might be built.

However, he argued that the process of financing such a project through the taxpayer is the setting up of a sinking fund, on which interest may be gained, instead of paid, by the town.

Building laws permit the town to set aside up to two mills of its tax rate each year to build up such a fund. If Manchester should do this, it might set aside about \$100,000 per year. This sum, as it grew, interest would accumulate.

No Future Emergencies

If such a fund were made a permanent feature of the town's appropriations, "Bowers feels that there would be in the future no

Jobs Increase In Most Areas

Upward Trend in Final Quarter of Year Is Noted in Report

Hartford, April 3.—The upward trend in employment in establishments covered under the Connecticut Unemployment Compensation Law continued during the six months from July to December 1946, as a decline in one area was more than offset by widespread gains in all of the other districts. Total wages paid to employees in the Connecticut area increased by \$47,549,794, or 12.0 percent, from \$398,440,329 in the third quarter to \$445,990,123 in the fourth quarter of 1946. Part of the increase in total wages may be attributed to Christmas and year-end bonuses.

The largest proportional increase in wages paid occurred in the Thompsonville area, which registered a gain of 20.9 percent, rising from \$6,457,150 in the third quarter to \$7,827,920 in the fourth quarter. Proportionally, the increase in the Danbury area was large also, with a rise of \$1,014,068, or 18.6 percent, in fourth quarter earnings as compared with the previous quarter. Substantial gains were made also in the Bridgeport and Meriden areas, each of which reported an increase of 17.3 percent in Bridgeport wages paid rose from \$65,224,903 to \$76,025,582, while New Haven reported a 15.4 percent increase from \$48,988,405 to \$56,559,400. Hartford an increase of \$8,181,092, or 7.1 percent from the third quarter level.

Federal covered employment in Connecticut increased substantially from 508,879 in July to 647,011 in December 1946, a rise of 48,272 or 8.1 percent. Seventeen of the 18 labor market areas reported increases in employment between 1.2 and 12.2 percent.

Families Going Slow On Return of Dead

Not Making Snap Decision: Three Fourth of Replies Favor Bringing Bodies Back

By Ruth Cowan

Washington, April 3.—(AP)—Should the remains of Americans who died abroad in World War II be brought home for burial? Their families are not making a snap decision on this, but three-fourths of those the government has heard from say yes.

Congress has authorized bringing the bodies back to this country at government expense if the relative desires.

The War Department Quartermaster sent out its first inquiry to the families of 60 per cent of kin of soldiers, sailors and marines early in March.

So far it has had fewer than 3,000 replies. But more than 70 per cent of those who have replied in U. S. ground troops and Marines early in March.

Major General Thomas B. Larkin, the quartermaster general, is charged with the responsibility of getting a supply of steel caskets located for the remains of many of whom have moved—and the sending families take their time to decide—talk it over with relatives and the clergy. It is to be decided by the War department. It is seen the question being asked is whether it will be September or October before it is decided.

Economy Drive Upset Feared

Disension and Confusion May Weaken and Wreck Movement

Hartford, April 3.—(AP)—Fears that disension and confusion might weaken and perhaps wreck the whole current legislative economy drive have been expressed by many veteran Capitol observers.

Opinion to that effect was expressed last night after former House Speaker E. Lee Marsh, Jr. (R., Old Lyme), had resigned from the General Assembly Special Economy Study Committee and Senator Alford F. Webster (D) had charged Gov. James H. Blaine with "definitely attempting to scuttle the economy program."

Future Major Issue

In a day of heated political battling, the future of the special and Republican House majority committee was a major issue, and when the legislators recessed for the night indications were that a showdown fight would develop on the floor of both chambers today.

The committee, which recently recommended methods to effect \$11,600,000 in savings over the next two years, further sought approval for an extended investigation and urged that the General Assembly convene in special session.
