The Senate Vote

The Senate vote on the program for military intervention in Greece and Turkey is today being hailed as a victory for President Truman. It is a poor victory, both in the methods by which it was obtained and in the destiny toward which it is most certain to lead the world. President Truman obtained this "victory" by first announcing, in his capacity of executive, a drastic change in American foreign policy. He then submitted this change to the legislative branch with the warning that if his policy were repudiated that would mean retreat. Under this compulsion, he obtained a vote, yesterday, of 67 to 23 in favor of his program. But if Mr. Truman has, by such methods, won the vote, he has not won the confidence either of Congress or of the people. He has not won that kind of victory which could have come only by persuading the members of the Senate that his program was right.

On Sunday, two days before the vote, the New York Herald Tribune observed that "ten days of debate on the Senate floor have simply demonstrated that, even though only a dozen votes may be cast against it, this is not a fair measure of the doubts existing in Congress as to the possible consequences of the 'Truman Doctrine'." Many admit they will have their fingers crossed when they vote for it. Even some of its strongest advocates concede that they regard it, at best, as the least of two evils.

Accurate reporting requires the conclusion that few, if any, members of Congress are preparing to vote for the bill with any enthusiasm. Today the New York Times describes the actual vote, saying: "It was evident from the mood of the Senate that this decision was not made happily." Mr. Truman obtained his "victory" by the expedient of making foreign policy before he submitted it to the Senate. But that larger and more impressive victory, which might have been the program passing because the Senate thought it good and was sincerely convinced of the wisdom, he gained, and could not gain, in any other way.

Any claim that this is a "victory" diminished still more when it is considered where this measure, if it is approved by the House in the manner and for the reasons, will lead us and the world. None of the debate, and none of the amendments, have changed the fundamental truths about the "Truman Doctrine." These fundamental truths about it are that it bypasses and forsakes the United Nations, that it establishes a two-world concept of our future, that it places the United States openly in the game of power politics, that in our first great open play in that game we have chosen a military partnership with dictatorial Turkey and given our backing to a dictatorship in Greece which has already taken our promise of aid as license for new persecution of its own citizens, that it establishes United States belief that communism can be fought and stemmed with such weapons, that it represents the last step but one in our "get tough" policy with Russia, and that it diminishes rather than increases the chance of that settlement and understanding with Russia which can alone create world peace.

Expert Assigned to Conduct Appraisal Under Government Support

Storrs, April 23.—R. G. Bressler, Jr., associate professor of agricultural economics, has been assigned by the Storrs Agricultural Experiment Station, University of Connecticut, to work with the Social Science Research Council on a project to appraise and plan research in agricultural marketing in addition to the regular research work at the University.

He will work with an advisory committee headed by Frederick V. Waugh, Council of Economic Advisors and former chief of the Division of Marketing and Transportation Research, U. S. Department of Agriculture. Other members of the advisory committee include D. B. Black of Harvard University, A. C. Hoffman of the Kraft Foods Company, T. W. Beahm of the University of Chicago, R. M. Southworth of the U. S. A. F. J. Welch of Mississippi State College and H. A. Weltman of the University of California.

The purpose of the research project is to appraise the present state of research in the social sciences regarding planning and forecasting, specifically, investment, grants and fellowships for the training of personnel, cooperation with existing agencies in scientific work, and other allied activities.

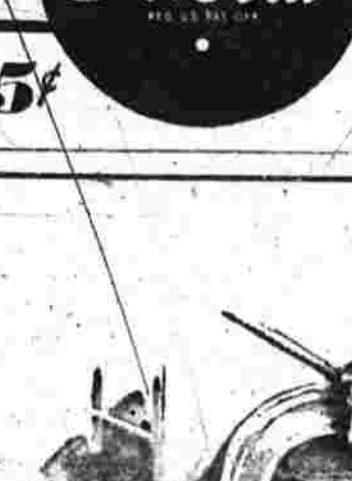

Hartford, April 23.—The monthly survey of employment conditions in Connecticut, issued today by the State Labor department, said today that "in a sustained demand expected in manufacturing and an increasing demand in construction and trade, no large surplus of labor will be available this spring."

The Labor department said that the metal fabrication industry probably would be needing additional help for some time. The report also noted that foreign employers have made reductions of varying amounts in their working forces on the basis of maintaining production with fewer workers as efficiently as possible.

Industries listed as having an adequate labor supply at present are textiles, apparel, food, glass and plastic, and aircraft and shipbuilding.
