### Rockville Order Flowers For Overseas

#### Red Cross Gets Word of Service Offered Now For Memorial Day

Rockville, May 1—Relatives and friends will be able to have wreaths placed on the graves of American war dead overseas this Memorial Day under a new service offered by the Florist Telegraph Delivery International, according to information received at the local Red Cross Office.

Orders are now being taken locally by Burke, the Florist and MacCarthy's Flower Shop, who are members of the international, with the minimum price being \$10 wreath, plus either airmail or cable charges.

Because the government requests a standard type of decoration for all graves on this day, and since florists prepared to serve military cemeteries will be handling a large volume of orders, nothing but wreaths may be ordered.

Under the program adopted by Florists groups, all overseas Memorial Day orders placed up to May 15 will be transmitted by airmail at a cost of 30 cents a wreath for Hawaii, 40 cents a wreath for Europe and 50 cents to the Philippines or Australia.

Orders placed up to May 22 will be transmitted by night cable letter at a cost of \$1.50 each to Hawaii and \$2.00 to all other countries where the service is available. Those placing orders after May 22 will be assessed straight cable rates, which are higher than the night rates, in addition to the cost of the wreath.

It is suggested that anyone desiring to take advantage of this service get in touch with either of the above florists for further particulars.

### Two Studies Reveal Situation in Greece

Porter Commission Report and Book by McNeill Both Make Public This Week

By James Marlow  
Washington, May 1—(AP)—This country, in planning to give aid to Greece to stop the spread of Communism, begins a new foreign policy.

No one knows how many other countries we may have to help in the same way or whether all this will lead to war with Russia.

What we do in and for Greece may change the course of history. For that reason, what we do about Greece involves you.

But what do you know about the Greek problem except perhaps something vague like this: There's a lot of poverty there and the Greek government is having trouble with the Greek Communists?

Two studies on Greece—on what is happening there, and why—have been made public this week. One is a report by a special Economic Commission, headed by Paul Porter, which this government sent to Greece to investigate.

The other is a book—"The Greek Drama: War and Aftermath"—written by William Harry McNeill, and published by J. P. Lippincott. McNeill, a major in the war, was in Greece as an assistant military attaché from November, 1944, to June, 1944.

Porter's commission made its report on Jan. 18 to March 22, 1947.

Had Story Told  
The sad story told by Porter's report tells a pretty and a gloomy picture of the Greek people at this time, politically and economically.

In short, it says the Greek people, drenched in poverty and politics, feel hopeless about getting back on their feet by themselves.

The lack of confidence among government officials and the people in the ability of Greece to save itself financially and the belief that it must depend on aid from abroad has contributed to an appalling inertia.

Wide Disparity  
There exists a wide disparity in the living standards and income throughout all Greece. Profiteers, speculators, and black marketeers thrive in wealth and luxury, a problem with which no government has effectively dealt.

At the same time the masses of people live on a bare subsistence.

The Porter commission's report runs about 60 pages, a sorrowful picture of a people chopped to pieces by war.

And in the end Porter's commission suggests the Greeks will have to have help from other countries for perhaps five years.

Book Gives Background  
But that report doesn't go much into the background or history of the present troubles there. McNeill's book does, in 201 pages.

It's a good book to read if you want to learn the Greek story in some detail.

It picks up Greek history about 1830, takes it through two World wars, the German occupation, the underground resistance, the liberation, the election, return of the king, and the present civil war.

Based on Surety Bonds  
In its action, which is based on surety bonds issued to the Greenwich postmaster by the two insurance firms, the government maintains that Mooney was at all times responsible for the defalcations.

What's in a name? Col. Joseph A. Dipina, a prominent American Legionist, is the defendant in a suit filed in Manila.

Stolen in and Out

### Good Teaching Talent Needed

#### Sees No Excuse for Taking Marginal Talent Into Schools

Hartford, May 1.—Addressing the first session of the State Parent-Teachers Association convention here last night, Dr. Altonzo C. Grace, state commissioner of education declared that "even under the present emergency there is no excuse for taking marginal teaching talent into the schools."

More than 600 persons attended the two-day session which elected Mrs. H. Otis Howgate of Greenwich as president to succeed Mrs. James I. Mainier of East Hartford.

**Favors Year-Round Service**

Asserting that he knew many of his suggestions would be controversial, Dr. Grace proposed that school boards consider providing a 10 months of school and employing teachers on a year-round basis. Schools, he said, should become a year-round service to the community with a one-month vacation for teachers and another month which teachers would spend on organized recreation for young people.

The commissioner said that he believed a substantial number of high school students are advanced enough to leave public school and enter college after their junior year.

**Work Opportunity Important**

He maintained, too, that an opportunity for work is an important part of high school education. "Any nation that permits youth to reach the age of 18 without having known the meaning of work is

merely setting the date for its own decline," Dr. Grace asserted. Teaching that he would prefer operating on a program of emergency certification for the next five years rather than allow under-qualified teachers to enter the profession permanently, Dr. Grace said that the "education profession faces one of the most formidable assignments, the recruitment of top talent for teaching and administration."

Other speakers were Hillis L. Itoman, East Hartford school superintendent; Roger Thompson of the State Department of Education; John E. Nichols, school building architect; and Miss Ruth Daniels, elementary supervisor of the State Department of Education.

### Good Teaching Talent Needed

#### Sees No Excuse for Taking Marginal Talent Into Schools

Hartford, May 1.—Addressing the first session of the State Parent-Teachers Association convention here last night, Dr. Altonzo C. Grace, state commissioner of education declared that "even under the present emergency there is no excuse for taking marginal teaching talent into the schools."

More than 600 persons attended the two-day session which elected Mrs. H. Otis Howgate of Greenwich as president to succeed Mrs. James I. Mainier of East Hartford.

**Favors Year-Round Service**

Asserting that he knew many of his suggestions would be controversial, Dr. Grace proposed that school boards consider providing a 10 months of school and employing teachers on a year-round basis. Schools, he said, should become a year-round service to the community with a one-month vacation for teachers and another month which teachers would spend on organized recreation for young people.

The commissioner said that he believed a substantial number of high school students are advanced enough to leave public school and enter college after their junior year.

**Work Opportunity Important**

He maintained, too, that an opportunity for work is an important part of high school education. "Any nation that permits youth to reach the age of 18 without having known the meaning of work is

merely setting the date for its own decline," Dr. Grace asserted. Teaching that he would prefer operating on a program of emergency certification for the next five years rather than allow under-qualified teachers to enter the profession permanently, Dr. Grace said that the "education profession faces one of the most formidable assignments, the recruitment of top talent for teaching and administration."

Other speakers were Hillis L. Itoman, East Hartford school superintendent; Roger Thompson of the State Department of Education; John E. Nichols, school building architect; and Miss Ruth Daniels, elementary supervisor of the State Department of Education.
