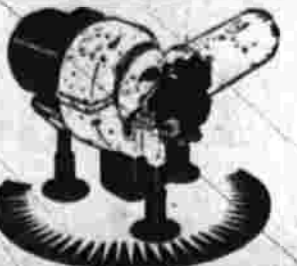

Problem Whether Just To Send Food and Other Relief or Information as Well

Editor's Note: This is the first of two stories on the fight over the State Department's information and cultural program.

Washington, May 7.—A struggle is going on here now over the State Department's information and cultural program. This struggle, between the department and Congress, may seem pretty remote from your daily life.

Try to Make Friends

The program tries to make friends and influence people abroad by telling them what we're like and what we want in the world. It does this in several ways: By radio broadcasts, by movies, by books, by pictures, by news, by general information.

This is being done at a time when Communism abroad is strong and may grow stronger among war-ravaged countries.

The problem comes down to this:

1. Is sending food and other relief abroad enough to win friends for us? Some congressmen think this is plenty.

2. Or, should we also keep other people informed about us and our intentions? The State department thinks this is needed, too.

In the current fiscal year which ends June 30, the State department will have spent about \$19,000,000 on this program.

\$31,000,000 sought

To carry on the program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, the department has asked for \$31,000,000.

This request was turned over to a subcommittee of the House Appropriations committee.

This subcommittee, since Republicans control Congress, was dominated by Republicans. And they have promised to cut government expenses.

No Decision On Old School

Question of Disposal Again Proposed by Board of Selectmen

The question of disposal of the Dixon school was postponed last night by the Board of Selectmen until the Joint School Board can consider the problem. Action is expected soon, for if the old schoolhouse is to be sold or razed, it is intended to include some reconstruction in the call for the special town meeting tentatively set for the first week in June.

Town Treasurer George H. Wadwell reported that he has secured an estimate on the cost of converting the school into seven apartment units of four rooms each. Such conversion, he said, would cost about \$48,000. The school as it stands is listed at a value of almost \$10,000.

Chairman of the Board Cecil England stated that he feels the town should not go into the housing business itself, and that if the place is to be converted into housing, the property should be sold. He noted, however, that the building is in such a state of disrepair that it would be the best usage for the structure as the location, he feels, is not suitable for the investment required.

Mr. Wadwell said that if zoning exceptions could be secured, the place might well be converted to a good warehouse.

It was pointed out that the selectmen have control of the building at this time since it has been turned back to them by the Board of Education, which has refused to become interested in using the old school for school purposes any longer.

Chairman England said that if the place is not to be used for a school, he would like to see it sold to the town.

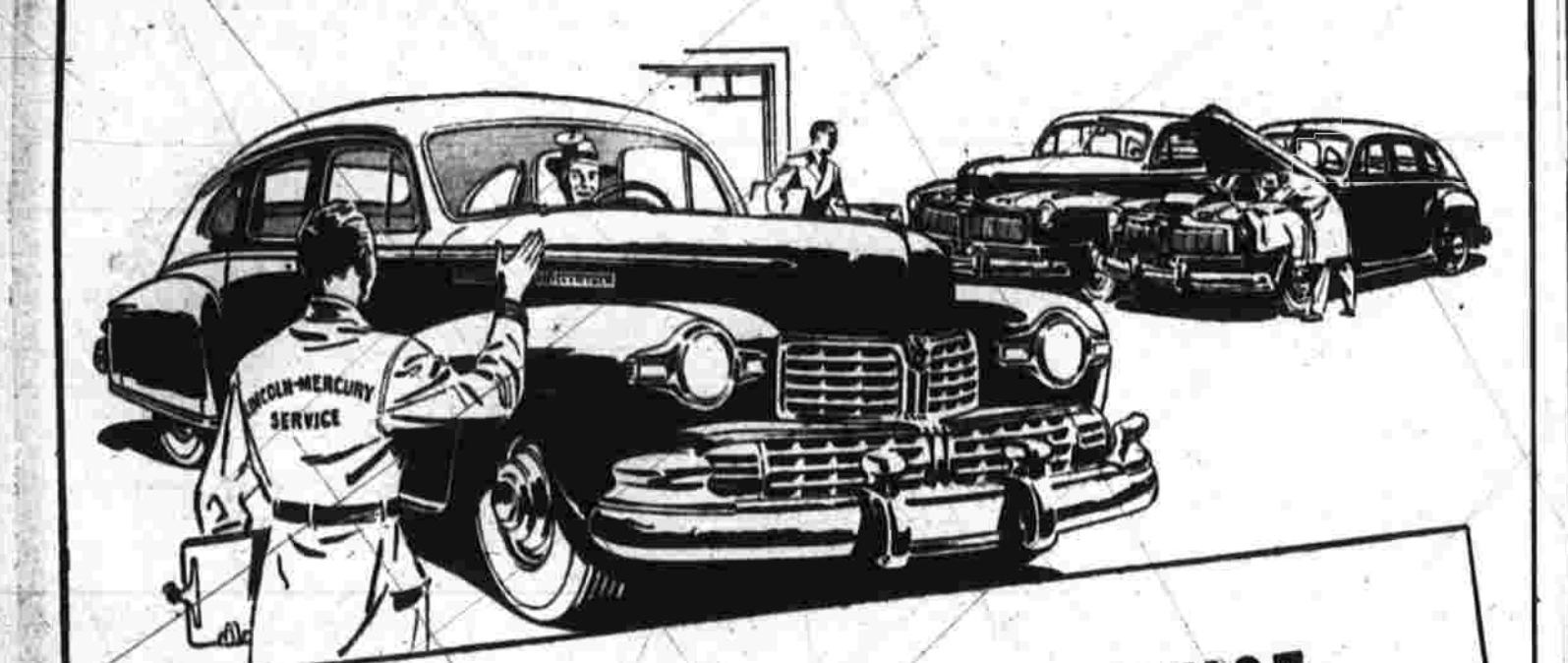
