Changes Offered On Sales Levy Lose in Senate

(Continued from Page One)

had virtually no chance of winning the Republican administration forces which outnumbered them 29 to 7. But they went into the fight against the measure, cornerstones of the administration fiscal program, with the express determination of putting themselves on record with hours of debate.

A small crowd was in the Senate chamber as the primary adjournment got under way at 11:15 a. m. (E. L.). More and more people began drifting into the room as word got around the Capitol that the battle of taxes had got under way.

Long Amendment Approved

A few minutes after the debate ended, the Senate approved a long amendment to the bill in the House, which passed the Senate 18 to 10.

Senate Chairman Herbert S. Macdonald

(E. L. North Haven) of the Finance committee sought to amend the bill by the insertion of a long amendment which was introduced by an objection from Senator Al-

fred W. Webster, the Democratic floor leader.

Webster had announced earlier in the week that he intended to speak at least four or five hours on the bill.

Macdonald opposed his amendment in the Senate chamber.

He told the Senate the sales tax was expected to yield about \$20,000,000 annually, was intended to pay for services asked for by the people.

The Finance committee's function, he said, was to "send out the bill for those services."

Macdonald contended that a sales tax meant that the cost of the services would be borne equally by everyone.

Some thought, he said, that he was giving an income tax, but he contended that levy would not yield sufficient money and would not distribute the tax load equitably.

15 Amendments Filed

When Macdonald had finished, Democrats began introducing the first of a series of amendments. Fifteen were filed with the clerk early in the debate, and there were indications of more to come.

The first Democratic amendment introduced by Webster proposed to substitute an income tax for the sales tax.

It was ruled out in order by the presiding officer, Sen. Gov. James C. Shannon (E. L.). His decision was sustained by the Republican majority over Democratic opposition.

Webster next sought to substitute a two per cent rate for the three per cent rate in the bill.

During the discussion, Senator Macdonald was supported by a series of questions from Democrats about technicalities of the bill.

The two per cent amendment was also rejected by the Senate.

Webster proposed other changes in the form of additional amendments.

The amendments came so fast that the first hours of the debate assumed all the appearance of an interminable series of questions and answers.

Session's End Seen Delayed

Intention to Conclude Assembly Tomorrow Encounters Resistance

Hartford, May 28.—Intention of Republican leaders to conclude the current session of the Connecticut General Assembly tomorrow has encountered resistance.

This developed late yesterday after the House passed the controversial three percent sales tax measure, 100 to 103, and the Senate voted adjournment until this morning.

The Senate action postponing debate of the sales tax bill prompted Speaker Luke H. Hitchcock (R-Conn.) to make a lengthy remark.

"The odds don't seem to be in our favor on Thursday," he said, "and I don't think we should adjourn on Wednesday. Let us adjourn on Thursday."

Rep. George C. Conway (R-Guilford), majority floor leader in the House, similarly commented that the scheduled Thursday adjournment of the legislature was jeopardized by yesterday's developments.

Conway voiced his opinion when Republicans plan to keep the lower chamber in session to consider the general fund budget, which will be immediately after the sales tax vote. The House approved, 90 to 88, a motion to recess until 11 o'clock this morning.

Behind the sales tax, the school aid bill also is ready for action in the Senate today. On the House agenda, along with the budget measure, are bills concerning the

prohibition of child labor in agriculture, re-allocation of highway funds and removal of certain restrictions on night work by women.

Former House Speaker Rep. E. Lea Marsh, Jr., (R-Old Lyme) moved that the House defer until today consideration of the \$97,000,000 general fund budget for the next biennium.

"Political suicide" seen in any move to adjourn today, Marsh said, "is to ask the members to remain in session into the night to discuss and possibly act on the budget."

Debate until today would be on the sales tax (used in the House) and the school aid bill. Monday he was prepared to talk at least five or five hours' session.

Wednesday noted that the constitutional limit on the session does not expire until Wednesday. June 4 was said to be thought there was

plenty of time to consider major legislation.

The Senate Democratic leader also mentioned the traditional dinner arranged weekly by the Legislative Executive Committee in Senate for last night in honor of its presiding officers.

James C. Shannon (R), Weehler said that to postpone it would be a needless discourtesy to the lieutenant governor.

But debate for five hours House Democrats lined up solidly against the sales tax but were divided by more than 50 Democrats. Bitter debate progressed for almost five hours while Hitchcock sought to ripple the bill with amendments substituting other forms of taxes, including an income

levy. All were voted out of order over their objections.

One amendment, however, received approval. Proposed by the Legislative Executive Committee it added newspaper sales and rentals of printed matter to the main list of exemptions which include food, children's clothing and utilities.

The sales tax, under terms of the measure, would be collected from retailers, who in turn would obtain it from consumers. The lowest free books while between 13 and 25 cents, two cents on those between 26 and 50, and three cents on those between 51 and \$1.12. Of sales of higher than

the tax would be three cents on each full dollar, plus the applicable fractional amount.
