Memorial Day Parade Seen Largest in Years

National Guard, Veterans' Group, Scouts, School Children, Three Bands to Participate

Parade starts in front of Army and Navy Club, Main and Forest streets at 9:30

Exercises at the Park. The parade will start at 9:30 at the corner of Main and Forest streets, moving north on Main street to East Center street, east along the north side of Center street to Spruce street, counter march west on north side of East Center street to east entrance of Center Park on Parker street.

Two companies of the Connecticut National Guard, veterans' organizations and their auxiliaries, Boy and Girl Scouts, school children, and with three bands participating in the Memorial Day parade tomorrow will be seen in several years.

The parade will start at 9:30 at the corner of Main and Forest streets, moving north on Main street to East Center street, east along the north side of Center street to Spruce street and counter-march along the north side of East Center street to Center Park where the exercises will be held.

Delegations from the Connecticut Memorial Day committee, decorated veterans groups in the East, West, Middle and South, and the James and St. John's veterans' organizations will arrive in the morning. There are 527 graves to be decorated this year and arrangements have been made for that purpose.

Decorations will be placed on each grave. This includes soldiers from the Revolutionary war, the War of 1812, the Civil War, the Spanish American War, World War I, and World War II. Wreaths and bouquets were being completed today by women who worked in the Army and Navy Club which will be participating in the decorations around the Soldiers and Sailors Monument at the Center tomorrow morning, and flags were ready for all of the school children who will march in the parade.
