Rutland Gets Power Back; Food Arrives. Rutland, Vt., June 4.—Fears of an outbreak of disease abated here today as Rutland residents carried on their normal lives. The city was cut off from the outside world for several days by a flood that knocked out all utility lines. Emergency relief stations were set up throughout the city with farmers from the surrounding country helping to serve milk and spring vegetables in a pail and bucket brigade.

2 Arabs Found Shot to Death. Bombings Wreck Athl. Railway Station and Cut Oil Pipeline. Jerusalem, June 5.—Two Arabs were slain today in new outbreaks of Holy Land violence during bombings, said British authorities. Record Set On Spending

Assembly Approves Expenditure of More Than \$285,000,000

Hartford, June 5.—Approving the 1947-48 general fund budget for the next biennium to an \$800 million for testing official document inks and typewriter ribbons were voted by Connecticut's 1947 General Assembly.

These are among more than 50 items appearing on an official listing released yesterday by the legislature.

Approval was given by the General Assembly to the expenditure of more than \$285,000,000 during the two-year period beginning July 1.

All-time record for public spending includes operating budgets and special appropriations totaling about \$216,000,000 for the biennium, and bond issues amounting to \$72,500,000 including that of \$30,000,000 for administering the state's new three per cent sales tax.
