He agreed with Wallace about a need for strengthening the United Nations, but differed with him on almost every other point, contending that the Truman doctrine was t designed to aid "reactionaries" but to maintain America's position until "we get the rule of law." to comment about Russia's so called "iron curtain," Wallace said he eved the Russians' only reason for maintaining it was to hide their pitifully poor and devastated co

In return for cooperating with Russia on world problems, the United States ought to get from that country, said Wallace, "a very clear-cut statement as to what her oundaries, geographically and in terms of policy, may be.'
