Paris, July 3 .- (AP)-The French Foreign Office announced today that 22 nations will be invited to a meeting in Paris July 12 to discuss European economic Soft Coal Miners cooperation as outlined in the Marshall proposal. Notable exceptions are Soviet Russia,

Spain and Germany. A French Foreign Office spokesman said it was proposed to have first report on European needs and ability for self-help ready by Sept. 1. The countries invited will in-clude Austria, Turkey, Albania,

Ireland and all former enemy states except Germany, it was announced. A Foreign Office spokesman said the invitations would be sent to Paris embassies tonight.
