Other weapons which will be on display at the three day exhibition will include, M-1 rifles, used extensively by the U. S. Army during the war and termed one of the most accurate firearms made by combat tested troops, hand grenades, 30 and 50 caliber machine guns, one of the latter to be mounted on a jeep as an anti-aircraft gun; the famed 60 and 81 m.m. trench mortars which were found to be an excellent weapon in the thick South Pacific jungles, Browning automatic rifles, Thompson sub-machine guns and also on display will be the much ball-hooped bazooka.

Those in Charge In charge of the exhibit will be Lieutenant Frank Moore, platoon commander of Company A. In charge of the demonstration squad will be Sergeant Albert Stevenson and Private Howard Gibson. Other officers of Company A will be on hand to assist in the exhibit.

The weapon equipment will be at a point somewhere between the Mary Cheney Library and the Police station in Center Park. Sanction of the Park Department has already been secured. Visitors are cordially invited to attend the exhibition while it is on display. It is expected that a large number of people will view the weapon display which will be the first in town since the end of the war. The exhibit is being sponsored as a feature of the current local National Guard recruiting drive.
