

This action by T.W.U.A.-C.I.O. has placed the New England mills in a strong position to compete with the South if wages are not cut in that section of the industry.

We Can't Do It All By its approval of the Taft-Hartley Bill, the Congress of the United States has made it more difficult for the Textile Workers Union of America to extend its organization in the South. This creates a definite threat to the New England industry, since it has been union strength which has kept wages

at an even level. The bulk of the Southern textile mills are still unorganized. Mill owners are waiting for an excuse to cut wages. And they can cut them in those mills without union contracts. For the legal minimum wage is but 40 cents an hour, half of the 80-cent hourly minimum set in union contracts.

New England Representatives and Senators are in key positions in Congress. If they want to, they can protect the New England textile industry from cut-throat competition by seeing to it that Congress acts immediately to increase the minimum wage to 65 cents an hour at once, and to 75 cents an hour in two years. If they fail to do this, they will bear full responsibility for whatever may happen to our textile industry.




