Batavia, July 22.—(P)— Dutch forces stabbed deeper into Indonesian Republican territory at a half dozen points tonight as Indonesian sistance. Fighting was reported in progress around Probolinggo, an important east Java port and an anchor of the Dutch beachhead along the northeast coastal road.

The beachhead — established by American-trained Dutch Marines in amphibious landings — now stretched east from the Propolinggo area to Pandji for a distance of some 70 miles.

The Dutch reported sharp fighting at several points, and the Indonesian Army said a battle was under way at Probolinggo. The Dutch said, however, that the columns along the coastal road were virtually unopposed.
