





The bill to which Hadden referred would permit gasoline distributors to retain more than \$1,-000,000 in state taxes withheld by them between 1935 and 1945. Suits Pending In Superior Court Suits filed by the state, seeking recovery of the money, are pending in the Superior court.

Questioned by reporters as to why he considered the law uncon-stitutional, Hadden said it contained no provision for reimburs ing the distributors who had not slected to fight the issue in the courts, but had paid the state's claims after the error was discovered in 1945.
