Years Now **Government Sets** 1948 Wheat Planting Goal Topping Any Wartime Or Post - War Target Washington, Aug. 1-(P)-Forecasting at least two more years f world grain shortages, the government today set a 1948 wheat planting goal topping any wartime r postwar target to date.

The Agriculture department called upon farmer, to seed at least 75,000,000, acres to the bread grain to permit this country to continue large shipments to shortage areas abroad at least until the fall harvests of 1949. The planting season for winter wheat is only a few weeks away. 1947 Goal Exceeded

Next year's goal compares with the 1947 target of 70,700,000 acres and with around 50,000,000 acres actually planted in the years immediately before the war. Farmers, however, exceeded the 1947 goal by about 7,000,000 acres—a de-velopment which helped produce the largest wheat crop in the nation's history.

In boosting next year's objective over the acreage originally asked for this year, the government post-poned, somewhat reluctantly, plans to urge farmers to retire much overworked wheat land to grass, pasture and other non-computer
