### Scientists Now Trying To Open Hearts of Atoms

Manhattan, Sept. 12.—(AP)—The mysterious forces of the atom are being opened up with 5,000,000 volts of electricity to have their secrets.

The result of split hydrogen atoms are fed into two feet of glass vacuum tubes. The split atoms are nearly paralyzed from heat, and those who cannot move arms and legs without making each a series of jerks are being operated by the American College of Surgeons here today.

Strangely enough this operation really affects not the neck but the brain. It was reported by Dr. A. V. W. Wilson of the Cleveland Clinic, Cleveland, Ohio.

All these conditions are caused by atrophy in some part of the brain. Surgery has been tried with some success in the brain to relieve palsy. But most of the conditions are incurable.

Dr. Stowell's operation severs a number of nerves in the neck, whose job is to control the tension of arteries carrying blood to the brain. All this tension stops when the neck nerves are severed. The arteries enlarge, and the brain receives more blood.

The extra blood to gray matter gives relief. Dr. Stowell said that the patients become happier, they can move with less jerkiness, they are less loss of the sense of feeling and their minds become keener.

Among those who will be on hand is Governor Ernest W. Gibson of Vermont, who served with the division in the Pacific as staff officer. When the division was mobilized at Camp Harding, Fla., in 1941, Gibson was a United States Senator and held the rank of captain with the 1724 Infantry.

He remained in the service and rose to the rank of colonel. A feature of the three-day convention will be united reunions, largest among them that of the 169th Infantry.

### Neck Operation Reported To Help Palsy Victims

New York, Sept. 12.—(AP)—People with shaking hands, and with limbs so weak they are nearly paralyzed from palsy, and those who cannot move arms and legs without making each a series of jerks are being operated by the American College of Surgeons here today.

Strangely enough this operation really affects not the neck but the brain. It was reported by Dr. A. V. W. Wilson of the Cleveland Clinic, Cleveland, Ohio.

All these conditions are caused by atrophy in some part of the brain. Surgery has been tried with some success in the brain to relieve palsy. But most of the conditions are incurable.

Dr. Stowell's operation severs a number of nerves in the neck, whose job is to control the tension of arteries carrying blood to the brain. All this tension stops when the neck nerves are severed. The arteries enlarge, and the brain receives more blood.

The extra blood to gray matter gives relief. Dr. Stowell said that the patients become happier, they can move with less jerkiness, they are less loss of the sense of feeling and their minds become keener.

A step-up in the effectiveness of the drug by combining them with urea, was reported by Doctors A. A. Johnson and W. James Gardner of the Cleveland Clinic.

Shelley was born in London, Ontario, Canada, Aug. 28, 1874. His parents were natives of Scotland. His father having been a native of St. Andrews, Scotland, and the Chicago Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Chicago.

He leaves his widow, Mrs. Catherine M. Shelley, and a daughter, Miss Margaret Shelley.
