

## Another Writer To Face Charge By House Group

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After the brush with Trumbo, the committee called to the witness chair Roy M. Brewer of Los Angeles who identified himself as the international representative of the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees and Moving Picture Machine Operators.

Brewer testified there has been no Communist plot to capture our union in Hollywood as a part of the Communist plan to control the motion picture industry as a whole. He said the plan "cannot be carried out because of the danger of exposure to the public."

He said in a statement read into the record: "The plan, as we see it, was to have Communist agents sent to Hollywood in 1938 in his successor, Herbert K. Sorrell, to infiltrate and control Hollywood technical labor while the Communist Party was active in Washington."

Deputy Prime Minister Herbert Morrison, immediately criticized Churchill's speech as "strenuously reactionary."

Making his fourth attempt to unseat the labor government by parliamentary motion, Churchill attacked the government's leaders, the "authoritarianism" in their plans for London conference with Russia.

Churchill declared that prime minister's cabinet, by substituting controls and planning for free enterprise, personal initiative and individualism, has destroyed the "mainstay, and until now, the mainstay of our life."

State Planning No Match for free enterprise system, the opposition leader said. He feared that "the doctrine and the doctrine of the Socialist government have destroyed or are rapidly destroying" creative impulses in Britain's national life.

"I feel fortified by what has happened in the United States," he declared, adding: "The sovereign remedy to our ills is to emulate the United States."

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The Soviet delegate also urged the committee to invite representatives of the Korean people to participate in the current U.N. debate on the Korean question.

"We must have the true representatives elected by the true Korean people from the northern and southern zones," he said.

### 35 Per Cent Along Saving Relief Grain

Industry Pledges Will Account for 35 Million Bushels; Most of Rest Due From Self-Denial

Washington, Oct. 28.—(AP)—The Citizens Food committee today estimated that it is 35 per cent along the way toward President Truman's goal of saving 100,000,000 bushels of grain for the relief of winter distress in Europe.

Industry pledges will account for some 35,000,000 bushels, the committee said, but most of the rest must come from public self-denial.

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Meantime the White House and legislators of both parties made plans for the Nov. 17 special session of Congress which will discuss the grain and other products.

Senator Taft of Ohio, candidate for the O. O. P. presidential nomination, announced today that he would support the Republican steering committee in a meeting three days after the special session.

One high White House adviser said last night that a proposal for price control at the level of the producer—less normal inflation—should be given serious consideration.

The official, who declines to allow the use of his name, indicated that the proposal would embrace only a limited number of commodities.

Churchill declared in a speech to the House of Commons that government restrictions were paralyzing the initiative and enterprise of the British nation.

Deputy Prime Minister Herbert Morrison, immediately criticized Churchill's speech as "strenuously reactionary."

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## Sales and Use Levy Totals \$9,561,944; Walsh Gives Report

### Manufacturers Blast Sales and Use Taxes

Hartford, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Connecticut Manufacturers association cut loose today with a double-barreled blast at the state's sales and use tax. Written in the smoke of the organization's gunfire were the following two recommendations to the special session of the General Assembly convening soon to revise the levy:

1. A reduction in the amount of the present tax from 3 per cent to not more than 2 per cent, or less if sound estimates warrant a greater reduction; and

2. Either amendments to the present act in order to exempt goods and materials used or consumed in production, including the instruments of production, or placing the present law with a gross receipt tax on retail sales.

The trigger setting of the shot at the sales and use tax was pulled by Edward Ingraham, president, in his report to the organization's annual meeting which opened here today.

Ingraham described his statement as a "double-barreled" declaration of policy on the matter since the present act and use tax was first introduced in the last legislature.

Mr. Ingraham said the association's position is that the repeal of the present law, unless accompanied by general sales tax, should be considered.

He went on to say that, contrary to widespread opinion, the association is not opposed to the sales tax in principle.

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## Brass Curtain Hiding Deaths

### Misouri Solon Says 'Many' American-Soldiers Killed in Trieste

Washington, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Senator T. Bennett (R., Mo.) declared today that "many" American soldiers have been killed or wounded in the "brass curtain" area behind a "brass curtain" of American military censorship.

The Missouri lawmaker returned from a six week tour of Europe and the Near East, said there have been "33 incidents of armed aggression by the Communist forces against United States forces since they moved into the former Italian territory, bordering on Yugoslavia."

"These acts have resulted in the death or wounding of many American soldiers," Bennett added in a statement issued here last night.
