

Salvationist Describes Life on Devil's Island

Most Inspirational Talk Given Here by Man Responsible for Its Abolishment

In one of the most inspirational talks given in Manchester in many years, a modern apostle last night told the story of the conquest of Devil's Island. Brigadier Charles Pean of France, through whose efforts the French government has decided to abolish the famous penal colony in Cayenne, told his audience at the Salvation Army club that a great deal of the credit must go to his co-workers. Since 1853 France has had a penal colony in French Guiana, on the northern coast of South America. The colony was established in 1853 and was originally settled by the English, except that in 1862 it was transferred to France. It was a generally more debased type of criminal was the inmate. Murderers and other felons, sentenced to hard labor in France, were transported to serve their terms on the island.

All Hope Abandoned
The man established there was on a small coastal island, and an account of the known of the tropical climate and diseases, the place came to be known as "Devil's Island." Here men abandoned hope. If they had been sent to the island for eight years or less, they were forced, under the system of "bondage," to stay in the colony as liberated men in the system of "bondage." They also had to pay their own passage, about \$100 for the return trip.

Brigadier Pean stated that at a man had a sentence of over eight years he might never return to France, but he had to remain in the colony for life. He was not allowed to be married, and he was not allowed to be fed by the government. After he was "freed" he was turned out to support himself in a place where the jungle was the only source of living. In this system, "liberated" men became as beasts, and soon perished of disease, starvation and exposure.

Over twenty years ago, while he was a student in the University of Paris, Charles Pean became interested in the service of the Salvation Army and changed from study of the social sciences to the study of the Bible. He then, shortly, he related last night his superior officer called him to a conference.

He decided to send you to hard labor on Devil's Island. Pean's commander told him, "I was told to make a survey of conditions there, to inquire as to ways in which they might be improved. I was told to correct the hopeless conditions that had grown up in the colony. The government had rather frugally given its consent for such a study."

Within a few weeks Pean was landing at Devil's Island. He stayed for three months. There were 5,000 of the most desperate criminals in the world who had been given up to a living death.
