





New York, Nov. 11—(P)—Senator Taft (R-Ohio) said last night that he favored "reasonable" aid to Europe to block the spread of Communism but declared that the Marshall plan, unless carefully administered, might encourage a "continuation of unsound policies" by European governments.

Taft, making his first speech here since announcing his candidacy for the Republican presidential nomination, listed "dangers" of the proposed foreign aid program as "further" inflation, continuation of "an intolerable tax burden," and re-imposition of wartime price controls.


