



Taken together, the two actions eased considerably the heavy pressure under which Premier Alcide de Gasperi's government has been operating for the past month. Reports continued to circulate, however, that Communist-led labor organizations intend to call a general strike in Italy soon, to coincide with one in France. The reports have been denied by the leftists.

The strike of city employees had been scheduled to start today, but the City Employees' National federation, announcing the government decision on funds, directed its members to continue work "until further notice."
