French Assembly Deputy Ejected; Session Resumes

10-Hour 'Silent Filibuster' by Communist Deputies Broken Today to Enact Stringent Anti-Strike Law Requested by Schuman

Paris, Dec. 2.—(AP)—New Communist hangers-on stilled a National Assembly vote today on a rigid anti-strike law as Communist-led strikers launched what appeared to be a concerted counter-offensive against government forces occupying their plants, depots and mines.

Paris, Dec. 2.—(AP)—A 10-hour "silent filibuster" by Communist deputies was broken early today and the National Assembly was called back into session (9 a. m., e.s.t.) to enact a stringent anti-strike law requested by Premier Robert Schuman to fight work stoppages paralyzing the nation.

Clear Strikers From Power Plants One stoppage was ended this morning when police cleared all-day strikers from six power plants in Paris area, permitting subway to resume operation after being suspended for several hours. More than 1,000,000 workers remained idle, however, stalling every major industry.

Speaker Martin (R-Mass) said today he will support the bill, which is aimed at breaking the Communist grip on the French labor movement and elected Communist Deputy Raoul Calon from the Assembly chamber.

Rome, Dec. 2.—(AP)—The Italian government staved off a nationwide strike of city employees today by agreeing to furnish some 200 million lire to the municipal governments enough money to pay promised wage increases.

**Missing Plane's Wreckage Found**

Tokyo, Dec. 2.—(AP)—A U. S. Army patrol found in a Mount Fuji crater today wreckage of an Air Transport Command plane missing since early Sunday. Its pilot and co-pilot, the only two men aboard, were dead.

The snow-covered slopes of the 12,461-foot mountain had made the search slow and hazardous. The two-engine C-47 plane had dropped from sight on a routine three-hour training flight from Haneda airport to Iruma base, near Osaka. Japanese first reported a crash near Mount Fuji, and Japanese mountaineers assisted searchers.

Names of the two dead were not announced.

**7 Less Traffic Deaths Noted**

**Record This November Is Better Than Same Month of Last Year**

Hartford, Dec. 2.—Seven fewer traffic fatalities were recorded in November this year as compared with November, 1946. The Highway Safety Commission reported today that the comparatively good traffic experience of the past four months is continued this month, the state again will show a decrease for the year as compared with last year when this state was one of the three states in the country to show decreases.

Confronted with one of the comparatively best 1946 records in the country, Connecticut managed to show additional decreases the first two months of the year, but from February until September the fatalities total was greater than for the same period in 1946.

Motor Vehicle department figures show that 207 persons were killed in traffic accidents for the first eleven months as compared with 218 for the same period last year. The reduction represents a 5.3 percent decrease. The National Safety Council reports that the country as a whole had a decrease of 4 per cent for the first ten months of the year. The figures are provisional in that if critically injured persons die the fatalities will be recorded for the month in which the accidents occurred.

While the state has a comparatively better fatality record so far this year the same is not true of auto accidents and injuries. Provisional figures for the period show 26,305 accidents as compared with 26,003 for the same period last year. The reduction represents a 10.74 percent decrease.

As of November 30, 79 of the 17 towns in the state were fatality free so far this year. A total of 72 towns were fatality free for the entire year of 1946 without a traffic fatality.

Mrs. James D. Price of West Hartford who is active in church and civic affairs, has taken over the position of recording secretary of the Connecticut Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

**Double Inquiry Into Air Crash**

Seattle, Dec. 2.—(AP)—A double-edged inquiry into the crash of an Alaska Airlines transport and the resulting death of eight persons continued today with Leon D. Cudeback, Civil Aeronautics administration regional chief, asserting that investigators have yet to determine:

1. Whether the plane landed within a safe stopping distance from the end of the runway.

2. Whether there was any functional failure of the large aircraft.

The plane, a DC-4 inbound from Alaska, overran the end of the Seattle-Tacoma airport runway Sunday, plowed about 175 feet through mud and plunged over a sharp bank onto a passing automobile.

In Washington, the Civil Aeronautics board ordered the company to show cause by Dec. 15 why it should not be required to stop scheduled operations between Anchorage and Seattle. The board said its enforcement section asserted the carrier was providing scheduled service between points not on its established routes and particularly between Seattle and Anchorage.

**Siegmar Blamberg to Address Welfare Gathering in Hartford**

A dinner meeting of the Connecticut Valley Public Welfare Association will be held Thursday, December 4th at 7 p.m., at the Bond Annex Hotel. Miss Margaret A. Hutchinson, president will preside. The speakers will be Siegmar Blamberg, of Manchester, Secretary of Inter-Group Relations and Research of the State Inter-Racial Commission.

His professional background is as follows: He received his Bachelor's Degree in Education from Temple University in 1931 and spent the next four years in the study of theology at Lutheran Theological School in Philadelphia and Temple University. He was awarded the degree of Bachelor of Sacred Theology from Temple in 1935. In addition to his studies in theology, Mr. Blamberg was the recipient of a fellowship at the University of Pennsylvania in 1937 and a Social Work and completed a three year graduate study there in case work and case work supervision. He has had extensive and successful experience as a member of religious education, social work, personnel work and human relations.

Upon completion of his graduate education, Mr. Blamberg was employed for four years in Pennsylvania as a case worker and case work supervisor in the public assistance program. From 1938 to 1942 he served as a Congregational Christian minister in various parishes in New Jersey. In 1942 he was appointed Director for the Good Will Industries in Chicago and the following year joined the staff of the American Red Cross as Supervising Director for the American Red Cross Service in Trenton, New Jersey. Immediately prior to joining the staff of the Inter-racial Commission, Mr. Blamberg was for three years Connecticut Valley Director for the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

Thomas P. Henry, Supervisor of the Fair Employment Division of the State Inter-racial Commission, also will speak. He was appointed to this position in September 1947 to direct the administration of the Fair Employment Practices Act which became law May 14, 1947. The FEPA outlaws discrimination by employers, unions or employment agencies because of race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry. A native of New London, Mr. Henry is a graduate of Holy Cross College and the University of Connecticut. He has held various positions in the State Personnel Department. Previously Mr. Henry had the position of senior personnel interviewer and claims examiner in the State and Federal Employment Services and served on the staff of the State Unemployment Compensation Division. Mr. Henry resides at 26 Monroe St., Hartford, Conn.
